PREFACE

The Capital Improvements program is an annual publication which identifies and describes all of the non-maintenance, physical improvements in Columbus for which funding is identified or anticipated in the next six years. This 1989-1994 version is the latest in a series of documents similar in format. Projects are grouped in two ways. The first grouping is functional. All projects for a particular operating division are presented together. In this format, all water lines are listed together, all traffic improvements are listed together, etc. The second grouping is geographic. All projects for a defined geographic area of Columbus are listed and mapped. For this presentation, information is summarized for 27 planning areas.

The Capital Improvements listed for 1989 represent that portion of the six year program which the city intends to accomplish in the ensuing year with newly issued or carryover funds. The remaining five years of the program, 1990-1994, reflect a plan for the timing and budgeting of capital projects. It is precisely this function as a planning tool for the timing of projects and the budgeting of debt which makes this document a valuable guide for the future of Columbus.

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INTRODUCTION

This 1989-1994 Capital Improvements Program (CIP) for the City of Columbus represents a joint effort of the Financial Management Division of the Office of Management and Budget, the Planning Division of the Department of Development and Columbus City Council. The document is an annual publication which identifies all of the non-maintenance, physical improvements in Columbus for which funding is identified or anticipated in the next six years. The Capital Improvements listed for 1989 represents that portion of the six year program which the city intends to accomplish in the ensuing year with newly issued funds and carryover funds from 1988. The remaining five years of the program, 1990-1994, reflect a plan for the timing and budgeting of capital projects. It is precisely this function as a planning tool for the timing of projects and the budgeting of debt which makes this a valuable guide for the City of Columbus.

FORMAT

This document has been produced in two parts in order to better relate the various projects with Columbus neighborhoods. The first part of the CIP is organized by City operating divisions participating in this Capital Improvements Program. A summary of each division's program is presented in a separate section and includes project titles, a projected six year budget for each project for which they are responsible and the source of funding to complete the project. Complete project descriptions and accomplishments for the previous year and highlights of the 1989-1994 program have been omitted. This information can be found in the City of Columbus 1989 Executive Budget document.

The second part of the CIP presents an analysis of the impacts and disbursement of projects by planning area. CIP projects are located on community maps for each of the 27 community planning areas in the City. In addition, a listing of city-wide projects which cannot be shown on maps as well as carryover projects, from 1988 are included. The carryover projects have been included on the maps. A section which lists projects for which locations are not yet known is included at the end.

VOTED BOND ISSUES

In 1981 it was necessary to secure voter approval for additional funds for capital improvements. Six broad capital project categories were approved by voters for inclusion into the CIP:

Police Fire Streets and Highways Storm Sewers Electricity Recreation and Parks (including Zoo) By 1985 all funds from the 1981 Bond Issue had been expended or committed and it was necessary to place another package before the voters. Emphasis was placed on basic projects principally supporting safety and streets issues, as well as the upgrading of existing facilities. The package was limited to \$51,000,000, a conservative figure and well within the City's bonding capacity. All issues were approved by the voters and the following represents the funding level by division:

Due to the financial health of the City the largest capital bond issue in its history (\$161,300,000) was placed before the voters in November, 1988. Again all issues were approved and as such will make the City eligible for additional contributions from State and Federal Programs. The package emphasized the need for safety, street and traffic improvements which can be readily seen in the issue allocation listed below:

Of prime importance is the Floodwall Levy - West Columbus Project. When completed, this project will permit redevelopment and revitalization projects to proceed in an orderly manner. Another important influence on the area will be the ultimate use of the Central High site which is now owned by the City. An extensive planning effort is now underway and the results will be studied carefully to determine the impact on the Franklinton Area.

The Lower West Side Sanitary Sewer Separation project is part of a major, continuing, long-term project which will benefit the entire area by improving its drainage. The health and safety benefits are considerable, although actual construction may at times be an inconvenience.

The reconstruction of the Spring-Sandusky interchange is very important with regard to travel within the Columbus area although specific impacts on the Franklinton area are more a result of location than function.

The Neighborhood Revitalization Area is part of a continuing effort to improve business prospects on West Broad Street.

Sewerage projects in this area of Franklin County are mostly in the engineering stage and will determine what services can be provided in the long run. Actual construction and phasing of projects will depend on the results of the engineering studies, the necessity of service based on development, and the availability of financing.

Improvements at the Southerly Wastewater Treatment Plant have city-wide impacts. Project 88 was being undertaken in order to meet EPA deadlines by July, 1988. Having met this deadline, further improvements will be undertaken.

Two new fire stations are included in the CIP. The station to be located to the southeast will greatly improve response times for this area. Fire Station South is included in order to provide fire protection for the area that may grow as a result of the air freight hub located at Rickenbacker Air Force Field.
