

**BASE BALL.**

**The Milfords Badly Scored by the Buckeyes.**

The Buckeyes have finally defeated the Milfords after trying three times in vain. On Saturday last they succeeded most effectually, however, as the score, 18 to 2, shows. The Bucks won by hard batting, earning eight runs out of eighteen, and by their fine fielding, kept the score of their opponents down to two. The Milfords played a weak game in the field, their batting being fair. Prather, Kaufman and Dagner did some good playing for them. The Buckeyes all played well, Little pitching effectively for eight innings in the place of Freed, who was almost sick from the effects of a cold taken at Delaware the day before.

Moore did his best behind the bat, and his catching and throwing were worthy of admiration.

Brady played first nicely, his catch of a hot liner in the third, and his difficult short bound pickup in the last inning, being features in the game. Nolen took care of second as he always does, neither he or Dodds making an error. The latter guarding third well, and in the sixth inning, made a fine running catch on a foul fly, which seemed almost impossible for him to get. Roberts "took in" two long flies in the left, and Sullivan one in the center. Our boys batted very heavily, Freed and Dodds each making as many as three base hits, and Nolen made two beautiful hits over center and left, taking second each time. The Milfords changed pitchers several times, Melish, Mitchell and Prather each having a turn at that position, but the Bucks were not bothered in the least. The weather was quite cold, but the crowd did not seem to mind it, and their interest was manifested to the close.
