SPECIAL WEATHER STATEMENT NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE COLUMBUS OH 305AM EDT SAT JUN 18 1983 AT 3AM EDT THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR AT PORT COLUMBUS INDICATED VERY STRONG THUNDERSTORMS OVER EXTREME SOUTHERN PICKAWAY COUNTY OF CENTRAL OHIO DRIFTING NORTHEAST AT ABOUT 10 MILES PER HOUR. FREQUENT LIGHTNING..VERY HEAVY RAIN AND POSSIBLY SMALL HAIL MAY BE EXPECTED FROM THESE THUNDERSTORMS. BECAUSE OF THE SLOW MOVEMENT OF THESE THUNDEARSTORMS COMBINED WITH HEAVY RAIN..FLOODING OF SMALL STREAMS AND LOW-LYING AREAS MAY BECOME A PROBLEM.

SPECIAL WEATHER STATEMENT NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE COLUMBUS OH 350AM EDT SAT JUN 18 1983 AT 345AM EDT THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR AT PORT COLUMBUS INDICATED VERY STRONG THUNDERSTORMS OVER EXTREME SOUTHWEST FRANKLIN..NORTHERN PICKAWAY AND WESTERN FAIRFIELD COUNTIES OF CENTRAL OHIO MOVING NORTHEAST AT 15 MILES PER HOUR.

SPECIAL WEATHER STATEMENT NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE COLUMBUS OH 625PM EDT MON JUL 18 1983 ...THUNDERSTORMS AGAIN IN CENTRAL OHIO... AT 620PM EDT WEATHER SERVICE RADAR IN COLUMBUS SHOWED THUNDERSTORMS OVER PARTS OF FRANKLIN..LICKING..PICKAWAY AND FAIRFIELD COUNTIES IN CENTRAL OHIO. BRIEF PERIODS OF HEAVY RAIN AND SOME HAIL IS POSSIBLE FROM THESE THUNDERSTORMS FOR THE NEXT FEW HOURS. ONE HALF INCH HAIL WAS REPORTED IN REYNOLDSBURG OHIO..IN EAST CENTRAL FRANKLIN COUNTY. THUNDERSTORMS WERE MOVING SOUTHEAST AT AROUND 20 MPH.

SPECIAL WEATHER STATEMENT NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE COLUMBUS OH 812PM EDT SAT JUN 18 1983THUNDERSTORMS SHOWING UP IN FAIRFIELD COUNTY IN CENTRAL OHIO.... AT 805PM EDT WEATHER SERVICE RADAR IN COLUMBUS SHOWED SEVERAL THUNDERSTORMS WITH VERY HEAVY RAIN IN FAIRFIELD COUNTY IN CENTRAL OHIO.

HEAVIEST THUNDERSTORM WAS LOCATED NEAR THURSTON IN THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF FAIRFIELD COUNTY.

THESE THUNDERSTORMS COULD CAUSE SOME FLOODINNG OF STREETS AND LOW LYING AREAS AS THEY DRIFT TOWARD THE NORTH AT ONLY AROUND 10 MPH. FREQUENT VIVID LIGHTNING AND SOME SMALL HAIL IS ALSO POSSIBLE. THESE THUNDERSTORMS SHOULD BEGIN TO DECREASE IN INTENSITY SOON.

SPECIAL WEATHER STATEMENT NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE COLUMBUS OH 912PM EDT SAT JUN 18 1983THUNDERSTORMS CONTINUE IN CENTRAL OHIO..... AT 905PM EDT WEATHER SERVICE RADAR IN COLUMBUS SHOWED THUNDERSTORMS WITH VERY HEAVY RAIN IN FAIRFIELD COUNTY IN CENTRAL OHIO. HEAVIEST THUNDERSTORM WAS LOCATED NEAR LANCASTER. THUNDERSTORMS WITH VERY HEAVY RAIN WERE ALSO INDICATED OVER NORTHERN HOCKING COUNTY IN CENTRAL OHIO. THESE THUNDERSTORMS COULD CAUSE SOME FLOODING OF STREETS AND LOW LYING AREAS AS THEY DRIFT TOWARD THE NORTH AT ONLY AROUND 10 MPH. FREQUENT VIVID LIGHTNING AND SOME SMALL HAIL IS ALSO POSSIBLE.
