## **January**

**Thursday, January 25, 1990**

SPECIAL WEATHER STATEMENT

NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE COLUMBUS OH

1250 PM EST THU JAN 25 1990

A HIGH WIND WARNING IS IN EFFECT THROUGH THIS EVENING FOR ALL OF OHIO.

A STRONG LOW PRESSURE SYSTEM WAS CENTERED IN SOUTHWESTERN MICHIGAN WITH A COLD FRONT FROM THE LOW CENTER SOUTH TO THE GULF COAST. AS THE LOW PRESSURE MOVES NORTHEAST THE COLD FRONT WILL MOVE THROUGH OHIO BY TONIGHT. THIS SYSTEM WAS CAUSING WIND GUSTS IN EXCESS OF 50 MPH. THERE HAVE BEEN REPORTS OF WIND DAMAGE IN WESTERN OHIO. ALONG WITH THE STRONG WINDS THUNDERSTORMS WERE OCCURRING AHEAD OF THE COLD FRONT. AT 1240PM A LINE OF SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS WAS FROM NEAR LIMA TO SPRINGFIELD THEN SOUTH TO THE OHIO RIVER. THE LINE WAS ABOUT 30 MILES WIDE AND WAS MOVING NORTHEAST AROUND 40 MPH. THUNDERSTORMS ARE EXPECTED IN THE COLUMBUS AREA BETWEEN 1PM AND 3PM THIS AFTERNOON.

AT 505 AM EST VISIBILITY AT PORT COLUMBUS INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT WAS ONE-EIGHTH OF A MILE IN DENSE FOG. THE FOG SHOULD CONTINUE DURING THE MORNING HOURS AND MOTORISTS TRAVELING THROUGH CENTRAL OHIO SHOULD BE EXTRA CAUTIOUS. USE LOW BEAM HEADLIGHTS AND REDUCE SPEED IN AREAS OF REDUCED VISIBILITY.

AT 800 AM EST VISIBILITY AT PORT COLUMBUS INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT WAS ZERO MILES IN DENSE FOG LIMITING AIR TRAFFIC TO AND FROM THE AIRPORT. THE FOG WAS ALSO PRODUCING HAZARDOUS TRAVEL FOR MOTORISTS.

AT 3 AM THE VISIBILITY AT THE PORT COLUMBUS INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT WAS ONE-SIXTEENTH OF A MILE AND MANY AREAS THROUGHOUT CENTRAL OHIO HAVE SEEN VISIBILITIES NEAR ZERO. MOTORISTS VENTURING OUT THIS MORNING SHOULD EXERCISE EXTREME CAUTION.

THE FOG SHOULD DISSIPATE BY THIS AFTERNOON AND DRIVING CONDITIONS SHOULD IMPROVE.
