DELAWARE COUNTY OFFICIALS REPORTED AN ICE JAM BACKUP 8 MILES NORTH OF THE COLUMBUS ZOO ALONG THE SCIOTO RIVER. THIS BACKUP IS NORTH OF THE DAM AT O'SHAUGHNESSY.

RIVERS ARE EXPECTED TO CONTINUE TO RISE THROUGH THE DAY AS SNOWMELT CONTINUES AND ICE FLOWS DOWN BOTH THE SCIOTO AND OLENTANGY.

THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE HAS ISSUED A FLOOD WARNING FOR THE SCIOTO RIVER IN CENTRAL AND SOUTHCENTRAL OHIO.

AT 1045 AM ...THE SCIOTO RIVER AT CIRCLEVILLE WAS AT 11.9 FEET AND RISING. THE RIVER IS FORECAST TO CREST AT 17.1 FEET SATURDAY MORNING. FLOOD STAGE IS 14 FEET.

PEOPLE LIVING IN AREAS AFFECTED BY THE FLOOD WARNING SHOULD TAKE FLOOD LOSS PROTECTIVE MEASURES. DO NOT ATTEMPT TO DRIVE ACROSS FLOODED ROADWAYS.

AT THE EXPECTED CREST STAGE OF 17.1 FEET...SIGNIFICANT FLOODING OF AGRICULTURAL LANDS AROUND CIRCLEVILLE IS EXPERIENCED. ALSO...HIGHWAY 56 FLOODS IN SOME LOW LYING AREAS...AS WELL AS SECONDARY ROADS NEAR CIRCLEVILLE.

...A FLOOD WATCH IS IN EFFECT THIS AFTERNOON AND TONIGHT FOR OHIO...

MILD TEMPERATURES ACROSS THE REGION HAVE RESULTED IN SNOW MELT DURING THE PAST COUPLE OF DAYS. MANY RIVERS ROSE QUICKLY ON WEDNESDAY ...WITH THE MOST SIGNIFICANT RISES THROUGH THE MIAMI AND SCIOTO RIVER BASINS. ICE JAMS ON SOME OF THE RIVERS WERE ALSO CONTRIBUTING TO THE HIGH WATER LEVELS.

PRECIPITATION IS EXPECTED TO MOVE INTO THE AREA BY LATE AFTERNOON.

SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS MAY PRODUCE HEAVY RAINFALL ACROSS THE

FLOOD WATCH AREA ADDING TO THE FLOOD THREAT.

MANY SMALL CREEKS AND STREAMS WERE ALREADY NEAR BANKFULL AND COULD RISE QUICKLY WITH ADDITIONAL RAIN. AN ESPECIALLY HIGH RISK OF FLOODING EXISTS ACROSS WEST CENTRAL OHIO BETWEEN DAYTON AND LIMA...WHERE THE LARGEST SNOW PACK WAS IN PLACE AND THE MOST MELTING WAS OCCURRING. THE OHIO RIVER WAS ALSO RISING AND COULD REACH AROUND FLOOD STAGE IN AREAS DURING THE WEEKEND INTO EARLY NEXT WEEK.

RIVER STAGES WILL CONTINUE TO BE MONITORED CLOSELY BY THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE OFFICE. ADDITIONAL STATEMENTS AND FORECASTS WILL BE ISSUED AS CONDITIONS CHANGE.

...FLOODING CONTINUES ON THE SCIOTO IN SOUTHWEST DELAWARE COUNTY...

DELAWARE COUNTY OFFICIALS REPORTED WORSENING FLOOD CONDITIONS ALONG THE SCIOTO RIVER IN AND NEAR KLONDIKE AND BELLEPOINTE. STATE ROUTE 257 WAS CLOSED BETWEEN STATE ROUTES 36 AND 42 DUE TO HIGH WATER. THE COMBINATION OF SNOW MELT AND ICE JAMS WERE THE CAUSE OF THE PROBLEM. THE BACKUP IS NORTH OF THE DAM AT O'SHAUGHNESSY AND WILL REMAIN NORTH OF THE DAM.

THE RIVER IS EXPECTED TO CONTINUE TO RISE THROUGH THE DAY AS THE SNOW MELTS AND ICE FLOWS DOWN BOTH THE SCIOTO AND OLENTANGHEY.

...RIVER FLOOD WARNINGS CONTINUE FOR POINTS ALONG THE SCIOTO...GREAT MIAMI AND WHITEWATER RIVERS...

AT 230 PM...SEVERAL RIVER POINTS ACROSS THE SOUTHERN HALF OF OHIO AND SOUTHEAST INDIANA WERE EXPERIENCING FLOODING. THE CURRENT RISES IN THE RIVERS WERE DUE TO SNOWMELT FROM THE PAST 2 DAYS. ADDITIONAL RISES ALONG RIVERS ARE EXPECTED LATE TONIGHT AND FRIDAY DUE TO A LARGE AREA OF RAIN MOVING INTO THE REGION.

RIVER LEVELS ARE RISING SLOWLY THIS AFTERNOON...BUT EXPECT LEVELS TO RISE MORE RAPIDLY BY FRIDAY AS ADDITIONAL RAINFALL CAUSES CREEKS AND STREAMS TO RISE ONCE AGAIN TONIGHT.
