A STRONG THUNDERSTORM WAS MOVING INTO SOUTHERN LICKING COUNTY FROM NORTHERN FAIRFIELD COUNTY LATE THIS AFTERNOON.

AT 455 PM NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR INDICATED A THUNDERSTORM ALONG THE FAIRFIELD/LICKING COUNTY BORDER ABOUT 10 MILES NORTH OF THURSTON.

THIS STORM WAS MOVING RAPIDLY NORTHEAST AT 45 MILES AN HOUR...AND WILL MOVE ACROSS THE SOUTHEASTERN HALF OF LICKING COUNTY THROUGH 530 PM. THIS STORM PRODUCED ONE-HALF INCH DIAMETER HAIL WHEN IT MOVED THROUGH BALTIMORE IN NORTHERN FAIRFIELD COUNTY.

PEOPLE IN THE SOUTHEASTERN HALF OF LICKING COUNTY SHOULD SEEK INSIDE SHELTER WHEN THIS STORM APPROACHES. THIS STORM WILL PRODUCE HAIL AND BRIEF HEAVY RAIN...ALONG WITH LIGHTNING STRIKES.
