WEATHER OBSERVATIONS AND REPORTS FROM COUNTY SHERIFF DEPARTMENT OFFICES INDICATED THAT DENSE FOG WAS OCCURRING IN THE PART OF CENTRAL OHIO NORTH OF A CIRCLEVILLE TO LANCASTER TO NEWARK LINE. VISIBILITIES WERE LESS THAN ONE QUARTER OF A MILE AND NEAR ZERO IN PLACES. THE VISIBILITY AT THE PORT COLUMBUS INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT WAS 3/16 OF A MILE. PATCHY DENSE FOG WAS OCCURRING SOUTH OF A CIRCLEVILLE TO LANCASTER TO NEWARK LINE...ACCORDING TO SHERIFF DEPARTMENT OFFICE REPORTS. CONDITIONS ARE FAVORABLE FOR THE DENSE FOG OR PATCHY DENSE FOG TO PERSIST IN CENTRAL OHIO OVERNIGHT. A RECORD LOW MAXIMUM TEMPERATURE TODAY IN COLUMBUS.

THE HIGH TEMPERATURE SO FAR TODAY AT THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE OFFICE AT PORT COLUMBUS WAS 9 DEGREES ABOVE ZERO...REACHED AT 355 PM. THIS BREAKS THE PREVIOUS RECORD FOR THE LOWEST MAXIMUM TEMPERATURE FOR FEBRUARY 18 OF 12 DEGREES...SET IN 1903.

THE LOW TEMPERATURE FRIDAY MORNING IS EXPECTED TO BE AROUND 5 DEGREES BELOW ZERO...WHICH WILL BE VERY CLOSE TO THE RECORD LOW FOR TOMORROW OF 6 DEGREES BELOW ZERO SET IN 1936.
