A STRONG COLD FRONT MOVING THROUGH THE REGION HAS BEEN SETTING OFF SOME STRONG THUNDERSTORMS THROUGH INDIANA AND WESTERN OHIO. THE STORMS ARE MOVING NORTHEAST AROUND 45 MILES AN HOUR AND WILL REACH THE COLUMBUS AREA AROUND 11PM. AS THE THUNDERSTORMS MOVE PAST THERE WILL BE PERIODS OF HEAVY RAIN..STRONG GUSTY WINDS AND POSSIBLE HAIL. THERE HAVE BEEN REPORTS OF WIND DAMAGE NEAR DAYTON AND TOLEDO EARLIER AS THE THUNDERSTORMS MOVED THROUGH THESE AREAS.
