418 PM EDT MON JUL 18 1988

A SEVERE THUNDERSTORM WATCH IS IN EFFECT UNTIL 10 PM EDT.

AT 405 PM RADAR SHOWED A LARGE AREA OF SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS OVER WESTERN AND CENTRAL OHIO. MOST OF THE SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS WERE WEST OF A LINE FROM ASHLAND TO LONDON AND WASHINGTON COURT HOUSE. THE SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS WERE MOVING NORTHEAST AT 25 MPH.

THE HEAVIEST THUNDERSTORMS WERE LOCATED IN CHAMPAIGN AND CLARK COUNTIES. THESE THUNDERSTORMS ARE ENTERING WESTERN UNION AND MADISON COUNTIES AND WILL MOVE INTO THE REMAINDER OF CENTRAL OHIO BY 5PM. NO SEVERE WEATHER HAS BEEN REPORTED WITH THESE STORMS BUT HEAVY RAINS STRONG GUSTY WINDS AND HAIL ARE POSSIBLE.

A SEVERE THUNDERSTORM WATCH IS IN EFFECT UNTIL 10 PM EDT.

AT 510 PM RADAR SHOWED A LARGE AREA OF SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS OVER THE WESTERN TWO THIRDS OF OHIO. THE SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS WERE MAINLY WEST OF A LINE FROM AKRON-CANTON TO ZANESVILLE AND PORTSMOUTH. THE HEAVIEST THUNDERSTORMS WERE FROM DELAWARE COUNTY THROUGH COLUMBUS TO NEAR PORTSMOUTH. ALL OF THE STORMS WERE MOVING NORTHEAST ABOUT 30 MPH. NO SEVERE WEATHER HAS BEEN REPORTED WITH THE STORMS AS OF 5 PM. THERE HAVE BEEN WIND GUSTS OF 40 TO 50 MPH AND RAINFALL AMOUNTS OF ONE TO ONE AND A HALF INCHES IN THE COLUMBUS AREA. HEAVY RAIN..STRONG GUSTY WINDS AND+ HAIL ARE POSSIBLE THROUGH THIS EVENING.

STRONG THUNDERSTORMS OVER WEST CENTRAL OHIO AT 1020 PM EDT WEATHER SERVICE RADAR SHOWED STRONG THUNDERSTORMS OVER WESTERN MADISON AND FAYETTE COUNTIES IN WEST CENTRAL OHIO. THE STRONGEST STORMS WERE LOCATED SOUTHWEST OF PLAIN CITY AND WEST OF LONDON IN MADISON COUNTY AND JUST WEST OF WASHINGTON COURTHOUSE IN FAYETTE COUNTY. THESE THUNDERSTORMS WERE MOVING NORTHEAST AT 20 MPH AND SHOULD MOVE INTO SOUTHERN UNION COUNTY WITHIN THE NEXT HOUR. OTHER THUNDERSTORMS OVER NORTHWEST OHIO EXTENDED FROM TOLEDO SOUTHEAST TO MARION AND FROM COLUMBUS NORTHEAST TO YOUNGSTOWN IN NORTHEASTERN OHIO.

633 PM EDT SAT JUL 30 1988

A STRONG THUNDERSTORM DEVELOPED OVER NORTHWEST COLUMBUS THIS EVENING. WEATHER SERVICE RADAR AT COLUMBUS SHOWED A THUNDERSTORM WITH HEAVY RAIN LOCATED JUST NORTH OF THE OHIO STATE UNIVERSITY AIRPORT IN THE NORTHWEST PART OF FRANKLIN COUNTY AT 630 PM EDT. THE STORM HAS SHOWN VERY LITTLE MOVEMENT.

A PILOT REPORTED TO OSU CONTROLLERS 1/4 TO 1/2 INCH HAIL HAD FALLEN NORTH

OF THE AIRPORT. OSU AIRPORT ITSELF HAD BRIEF WINDS OF 30 MPH. THE STORM HAS SHOWN SOME SIGNS OF WEAKENING AND IS EXPECTED TO DIE OUT BY 800 PM EDT.

STRONG THUNDERSTORMS ARE MOVING TOWARD CENTRAL OHIO FROM THE NORTHWEST. AT 915 PM THE COLUMBUS RADAR INDICATED STRONG THUNDERSTORMS OVER NORTHWEST OHIO. THE LEADING EDGE OF THE THE THUNDERSTORMS WAS FROM NEAR SANDUSKY TO FINDLAY THEN WEST INTO INDIANA. THE AREA OF SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS WAS ABOUT 60 MILES WIDE AND WAS MOVING SOUTHEAST AT 30 TO 35 MILES AN HOUR.

THE THUNDERSTORMS WILL REACH NORTHERN MARION AND UNION COUNTIES BY 10 TO 11 PM THEN CONTINUE TO MOVE INTO CENTRAL OHIO BY EARLY MORNING. NO SEVERE WEATHER HAS BEEN REPORTED WITH THE THUNDERSTORMS BUT WIND GUSTS TO 43 MILES AN HOUR HAVE OCCURRED. ALONG WITH THE STRONG WINDS BRIEF HEAVY RAIN AND SMALL HAIL ARE POSSIBLE WITH THESE STORMS.

STRONG THUNDERSTORMS ARE MOVING TOWARD CENTRAL OHIO FROM THE NORTHWEST. AT 915 PM THE COLUMBUS RADAR INDICATED STRONG THUNDERSTORMS OVER NORTHWEST OHIO. THE LEADING EDGE OF THE THE THUNDERSTORMS WAS FROM NEAR SANDUSKY TO FINDLAY THEN WEST INTO INDIANA. THE AREA OF SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS WAS ABOUT 60 MILES WIDE AND WAS MOVING SOUTHEAST AT 30 TO 35 MILES AN HOUR.

THE THUNDERSTORMS WILL REACH NORTHERN MARION AND UNION COUNTIES BY 10 TO 11 PM THEN CONTINUE TO MOVE INTO CENTRAL OHIO BY EARLY MORNING. NO SEVERE WEATHER HAS BEEN REPORTED WITH THE THUNDERSTORMS BUT WIND GUSTS TO 43 MILES AN HOUR HAVE OCCURRED.
