611 AM EST THU MAR 3 1988

LIGHT RAIN WAS FALLING OVER CENTRAL OHIO WITH TEMPERATURES IN THE LOW TO MID 30S. AT 6 AM THE TEMPERATURE AT THE PORT COLUMBUS NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE OFFICE WAS 33 DEGREES. TRAVELLERS IN CENTRAL OHIO SHOULD BE ALERT FOR POSSIBLE ICY SPOTS ON ROAD SURFACES THIS MORNING ESPECIALLY ON BRIDGES AND OVERPASSES.

LIGHT RAIN HAS CHANGED TO A MIXTURE OF FREEZING RAIN...SLEET AND SNOW OVER MUCH OF CENTRAL OHIO THIS MORNING.

AT 830 AM THE TEMPERATURE AT THE PORT COLUMBUS NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE OFFICE WAS JUST ABOVE FREEZING WITH ROADS BECOMING SLIPPERY FROM THE WINTRY PRECIPITATION. ROAD SURFACES WERE ESPECIALLY SLIPPERY ON BRIDGES AND OVERPASSES. WEATHER SERVICE RADAR SHOWED PRECIPITATION COVERING ALL OF CENTRAL OHIO. SINCE TEMPERATURES ARE SLOW TO RISE THIS MORNING... A MIXTURE OF RAIN... FREEZING RAIN... SLEET AND SNOW IS LIKELY TO CONTINUE THROUGH MOST OF THE MORNING HOURS.

A WINTER STORM WARNING IS IN EFFECT NORTH OF I-70 WITH A WINTER WEATHER ADVISORY SOUTH OF I-70 TONIGHT.

HEAVY SNOW IN NORTH CENTRAL OHIO HAD PRODUCED 2 TO 5 INCHES IN PARTS OF NORTH CENTRAL OHIO. MOST OF THE SNOW WAS NORTH OF I-70 WITH FREEZING RAIN AND DRIZZLE SOUTH OF I-70 DURING THE AFTERNOON.

SOME REPORTED SNOWFALL AMOUNTS AS OF 5PM EST: 5 INCHES IN MARION COUNTY...3 MILES NORTH OF THE CITY OF MARION. 1-2 INCHES IN UNION AND DELAWARE COUNTIES. THE SNOW CHANGED TO FREEZING RAIN IN MADISON COUNTY WHERE THERE WERE REPORTS OF DAMAGE TO TREES AND POWER LINES.

A WINTER STORM WARNING IS IN EFFECT FOR THE NORTHERN TWO-THIRDS OF OHIO TONIGHT. THE SOUTHERN THIRD OF OHIO IS UNDER A FREEZING RAIN ADVISORY. FREEZING RAIN HAS BEEN FALLING OVER MOST OF CENTRAL OHIO SINCE THIS AFTERNOON CAUSING HAZARDOUS DRIVING CONDITIONS. THE ICE ACCUMULATION HAS BEEN RESPONSIBLE FOR DOWNED POWER LINES AND MANY BROKEN TREE LIMBS.

HEAVY SNOW HAS FALLEN OVER THE NORTH CENTRAL SECTIONS OF THE STATE WITH AMOUNTS OF 4 TO 7 INCHES BEING REPORTED IN MARION COUNTY. FREEZING RAIN OCCASIONALLY MIXED WITH SLEET OR SNOW WILL CONTINUE OVER CENTRAL OHIO THROUGH TONIGHT. THE HEAVIEST SNOW WILL BE WELL NORTH OF I-70 WHERE AN ADDITIONAL 4 INCHES COULD FALL BY MORNING. DRIVING CONDITIONS WILL REMAIN HAZARDOUS OVER ALL OF CENTRAL OHIO TONIGHT AS THE FREEZING RAIN WILL CONTINUE TO CAUSE ICE BUILDUPS ON THE HIGHWAYS.

AT 340 PM EDT WEATHER SERVICE RADAR INDICATED AN INTENSE THUNDERSTORM IN NORTHERN MADISON COUNTY JUST NORTHEAST OF LONDON. THE STORM WAS MOVING EAST NORTHEAST AT 45 MPH AND WILL MOVE THROUGH NORTHEAST MADISON AND NORTHERN FRANKLIN COUNTIES BY 430 PM.
