AT 320 AM FREEZING RAIN AND SLEET WAS OCCURRING AT PORT COLUMBUS. THE TEMPERATURE WAS 36 DEGREES...HOWEVER ROAD SURFACES WERE BELOW FREEZING RESULTING IN A COATING OF ICE ON ROADS.

THERE HAVE BEEN REPORTS OF SLIPPERY ROADS IN COLUMBUS AND FRANKLIN COUNTY. BRIDGES AND OVERPASSES ARE LIKELY TO ESPECIALLY HAZARDOUS. THE PRECIPITATION IS EXPECTED TO END BEFORE THE MORNING RUSH HOUR, AND CONDITIONS SHOULD SLOWLY IMPROVE AS TEMPERATURES REMAIN ABOVE FREEZING.

A HIGH WIND WARNING IS IN EFFECT THROUGH THIS EVENING FOR ALL OF OHIO. A STRONG LOW PRESSURE SYSTEM WAS CENTERED IN SOUTHWESTERN MICHIGAN WITH A COLD FRONT FROM THE LOW CENTER SOUTH TO THE GULF COAST. AS THE LOW PRESSURE MOVES NORTHEAST THE COLD FRONT WILL MOVE THROUGH OHIO BY TONIGHT. THIS SYSTEM WAS CAUSING WIND GUSTS IN EXCESS OF 50 MPH. THERE HAVE BEEN REPORTS OF WIND DAMAGE IN WESTERN OHIO. ALONG WITH THE STRONG WINDS THUNDERSTORMS WERE OCCURRING AHEAD OF THE COLD FRONT. AT 1240PM A LINE OF SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS WAS FROM NEAR LIMA TO SPRINGFIELD THEN SOUTH TO THE OHIO RIVER. THE LINE WAS ABOUT 30 MILES WIDE AND WAS MOVING NORTHEAST AROUND 40 MPH. THUNDERSTORMS ARE EXPECTED IN THE COLUMBUS AREA BETWEEN 1PM AND 3PM THIS AFTERNOON.

AT 805 PM NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR INDICATED A LARGE AREA OF RAINFALL OVER THE CENTRAL PORTION OF THE STATE WITH MODERATE TO HEAVY RAIN IN THE SOUTH CENTRAL OHIO COUNTIES OF ROSS..HOCKING AND VINTON. THE RAIN WAS MOVING TO THE NORTHEAST AT 15 MILES AN HOUR AND WILL CONTINUE THROUGH THE NIGHTTIME HOURS.
