SPECIAL WEATHER STATEMENT

NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE COLUMBUS OH

835 PM EST FRI JAN 3 1992

DENSE FOG HAS DEVELOPED OVER CENTRAL OHIO NORTH OF COLUMBUS.

BETWEEN 800 AND 830 PM LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICIALS IN MARION...UNION AND DELAWARE COUNTIES REPORTED THAT DENSE FOG HAD DEVELOPED IN MANY LOCATIONS AND WAS REDUCING THE VISIBILITY TO NEAR ZERO. PEOPLE PLANNING TRAVEL IN THE AREA NORTH OF COLUMBUS TONIGHT SHOULD USE EXTRA CAUTION. BE PREPARED FOR RAPIDLY LOWERING VISIBILITIES AND ALLOW EXTRA TRAVEL TIME.

OVER THE REMAINDER OF CENTRAL OHIO...VISIBILITIES WERE STILL GOOD AS OF 830 PM. HOWEVER...A FEW PATCHES OF DENSE FOG COULD DEVELOP LATER TONIGHT AND MOTORISTS SHOULD BE CAUTIOUS WHEN ENCOUNTERING ANY OF THESE AREAS OF DENSE FOG.

734 AM EST SAT JAN 4 1992

PATCHY DENSE FOG DEVELOPED OVER CENTRAL OHIO THIS MORNING.

AT 725 AM SHERIFF DEPARTMENT OFFICIALS REPORTED PATCHY AREAS OF DENSE FOG WITH VISIBILITIES NEAR ZERO IN FRANKLIN...DELAWARE...MADISON AND UNION COUNTIES.

AT 730 AM THE VISIBILITY AT THE COLUMBUS AIRPORT WAS ONE EIGHTH OF A MILE. AREAS OF DENSE FOG AND NEAR ZERO VISIBILITY WERE REPORTED THROUGHOUT THE COLUMBUS METROPOLITAN AREA.

THE FOG WILL SLOWLY LIFT THIS MORNING AND VISIBILITIES WILL INCREASE TO MORE THAN THREE MILES BY 10 AM.

**Monday, January 13, 1992**

A Winter Storm Watch is issued at 3:30AM for Central Ohio for the late evening through Tuesday, January 14<sup>th</sup>. Full text unavailable.

The Winter Storm Watch is upgraded to a Winter Storm Warning at 2:50PM. The Warning is for the late

night through Tuesday, January 14<sup>th</sup>, and calls for rain changing to snow with accumulations of around 4". Full text unavailable.

A WINTER STORM WARNING IS IN EFFECT FOR CENTRAL OHIO LATE TONIGHT AND TUESDAY. A WINTER STORM WATCH IS IN EFFECT FOR EAST CENTRAL AND SOUTHEAST OHIO TUESDAY.

RAIN WILL CHANGE TO SNOW LATE TONIGHT IN CENTRAL OHIO...AND EARLY TUESDAY ACROSS EAST CENTRAL AND SOUTHEAST OHIO.

THE SNOW MAY BE HEAVY AT TIMES...ESPECIALLY TUESDAY MORNING. MANY LOCATIONS COULD RECEIVE 4 INCHES OF SNOW BEFORE THE STORM ENDS LATE TUESDAY AFTERNOON. THE MORNING COMMUTE MAY BE TREACHEROUS IN CENTRAL OHIO AS AN INCH OF SNOW IS POSSIBLE BY MORNING. STRONG NORTH WINDS WILL RESULT IN SIGNIFICANT BLOWING AND DRIFTING SNOW MAKING TRAVEL DIFFICULT THROUGHOUT CENTRAL OHIO.

IT MAY BE A GOOD IDEA TO COMPLETE AS MANY TASKS AND ERRANDS AS POSSIBLE THIS EVENING SINCE CONDITIONS WILL BE ADVERSE TOMORROW.

**Tuesday, January 14, 1992**

The Winter Storm Warning is changed to a Snow Advisory at 3:30AM. The Advisory calls for snow and blowing snow with accumulations of 2"-4". Full text unavailable.

A SNOW ADVISORY IS IN EFFECT FOR ALL OF CENTRAL OHIO TODAY. A SNOW ADVISORY IS IN EFFECT THIS AFTERNOON AND TONIGHT FOR ALL OF SOUTH CENTRAL AND EAST CENTRAL OHIO.

AT 735 AM LIGHT SNOW CONTINUED OVER ALL OF CENTRAL OHIO AND TEMPERATURES WERE BELOW FREEZING. THERE HAVE BEEN SEVERAL REPORTS OF WIND GUSTS TO 30 MILES AN HOUR WITH BLOWING SNOW REDUCING VISIBILITIES TO NEAR ZERO AT TIMES.

SHERIFF DEPARTMENT OFFICIALS FROM MARION...UNION...DELAWARE AND MADISON COUNTIES REPORTED THAT ROADS ARE BECOMING SLIPPERY.

THE SNOW WILL CONTINUE THROUGH MID AFTERNOON BEFORE TAPER TO FLURRIES. TEMPERATURES WILL FALL THROUGH THE TWENTIES AND ROADS THROUGHOUT CENTRAL OHIO WILL BECOME SLIPPERY. TOTAL SNOW ACCUMULATION WILL RANGE FROM 2 TO 4 INCHES.

The Snow Advisory is re-upgraded to a Winter Storm Warning at 9:20AM. It is for the daytime hours into the afternoon, and calls for snow accumulations of 3"-5". Full text unavailable.

A WINTER STORM WARNING IS IN EFFECT FOR ALL OF CENTRAL OHIO THIS AFTERNOON. A SNOW ADVISORY IS IN EFFECT FOR SOUTH CENTRAL AND EAST

CENTRAL OHIO THIS AFTERNOON AND EARLY TONIGHT.

AT 1130 AM NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR INDICATED LIGHT TO MODERATE SNOW OVER ALL OF CENTRAL OHIO. THE SNOW WAS MOVING TO THE EAST AT 20 MILES AN HOUR AND WILL CONTINUE OVER CENTRAL OHIO THROUGH THE AFTERNOON.

SHERIFF DEPARTMENT OFFICIALS THROUGHOUT CENTRAL OHIO REPORTED 1 TO 3 INCHES OF SNOW ON THE GROUND. AT 1130 AM TWO AND A HALF INCHES WERE ON THE GROUND AT THE COLUMBUS AIRPORT. TEMPERATURES WERE IN THE MID TWENTIES AND ROADS THOUGHOUT CENTRAL OHIO WERE SLIPPERY.

STRONG NORTHWEST WINDS WERE RECORDED IN THE 20 TO 30 MILE AND HOUR RANGE WITH HIGHER GUSTS. THE STRONG WINDS WERE CAUSING BLOWING SNOW WITH VISIBILITIES REDUCED TO LESS THAN ONE HALF OF A MILE AT TIMES.

THE SNOW WILL TAPER TO FLURRIES LATE THIS AFTERNOON WITH ADDITIONAL ACCUMULATIONS OF 1 TO 2 INCHES LIKELY.

THE MAJOR WINTER STORM WHICH BROUGHT THE SNOW AND BLOWING SNOW TO CENTRAL OHIO TODAY HAS RAPIDLY MOVED NORTHEAST INTO NEW ENGLAND...AND SKIES ARE RAPIDLY CLEARING ACROSS CENTRAL OHIO. SNOW DEPTHS ACROSS CENTRAL OHIO ARE AS FOLLOWS:

UNION AND MARION COUNTIES: 4 INCHES

FRANKLIN AND DELAWARE COUNTIES: 3 INCHES

LICKING COUNTY: 2 1/2 INCHES

PICKAWAY AND MADISON COUNTIES: 2 INCHES

MUSKINGUM COUNTY: 1 TO 2 INCHES

FAIRFIELD AND PERRY COUNTIES: AROUND 1 INCH

HOCKING...ROSS...ATHENS...VINTON...AND MORGAN COUNTIES: LESS THAN 1 INCH

THROUGHOUT CENTRAL OHIO...ROADS WHICH WERE WET FROM SNOWFALL TODAY WILL BECOME ICY AS THE TEMPERATURE CONTINUES TO DROP TONIGHT UNDER CLEARING SKIES. PEOPLE PLANNING TO TRAVEL IN CENTRAL OHIO TONIGHT SHOULD BE PREPARED TO ENCOUNTER ICY AREAS ON ROADS...ESPECIALLY ON UNTREATED AND SECONDARY ROADS.

### **Wednesday, January 15, 1992**

A Snow Advisory is issued for Central Ohio at 3:30AM. It is for the afternoon and evening with total snow accumulations of 2"-3". Full text unavailable.

The Snow Advisory is upgraded to a Winter Storm Warning at 10AM for the afternoon and early evening. The Warning calls for 2"-4" of snow accumulation. Full text unavailable.

247 PM EST WED JAN 15 1992

A WINTER STORM WARNING IS IN EFFECT FOR CENTRAL AND EAST CENTRAL OHIO THIS AFTERNOON AND EARLY TONIGHT. A SNOW ADVISORY IS IN EFFECT FOR SOUTH CENTRAL OHIO.

SNOW DEVELOPED OVER MOST OF INDIANA THIS AFTERNOON AS INDICATED BY THE LATEST SURFACE OBSERVATIONS. SOME OF THE SNOW WAS HEAVY AND AS MUCH AS 2 INCHES OF SNOW FELL IN 1 HOUR OVER CENTRAL INDIANA.

AT 245 PM NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR INDICATED AN AREA OF LIGHT SNOW OVER WEST CENTRAL OHIO. THE SNOW WAS MOVING EAST AT 30 MILES AN HOUR AND WILL REACH THE COLUMBUS METROPOLITAN AREA BY 4 PM.

TOTAL SNOW ACCUMULATIONS WILL RANGE FROM 2 TO 4 INCHES ACROSS CENTRAL OHIO AND AROUND AN INCH IN SOUTH CENTRAL OHIO.

AFTER THE FRONT PASSES THROUGH CENTRAL OHIO THIS EVENING TEMPERATURES WILL DROP RAPIDLY INTO THE TEENS. BRIEF PERIODS OF HEAVY SNOW AND STRONG GUSTY NORTHWEST WINDS WILL DROP VISIBILITIES TO NEAR ZERO AT TIMES. WIND CHILLS WILL DROP WELL BELOW ZERO.

HAZARDOUS DRIVING CONDITIONS WILL DEVELOP ACROSS ALL OF CENTRAL OHIO BY EARLY EVENING. MOTORISTS TRAVELING THROUGH CENTRAL OHIO THIS EVENING SHOULD SLOW DOWN AND ALLOW FOR EXTRA TRAVELING TIME.

A WINTER STORM WARNING IS IN EFFECT FOR CENTRAL AND EAST-CENTRAL OHIO THIS EVENING AND EARLY TONIGHT. A SNOW AND BLOWING SNOW ADVISORY IS IN EFFECT FOR SOUTH-CENTRAL OHIO THIS EVENING AND EARLY TONIGHT.

AT 540 PM NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR AND SURFACE WEATHER OBSERVATIONS INDICATED A LARGE AREA OF MODERATE TO HEAVY SNOW OVER CENTRAL OHIO. THIS SNOW AREA WAS MOVING EAST AT 40 MILES AN HOUR.

AT THE PORT COLUMBUS INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT...NEARLY ONE AND ONE-HALF INCHES OF SNOW HAS FALLEN SINCE IT BEGAN AROUND 330 PM. ROADS ARE SNOW-COVERED AND SLIPPERY ACROSS CENTRAL OHIO...WHERE 1 TO 2 INCHES OF SNOW HAS ALREADY FALLEN. THE HEAVIER SNOW WILL CONTINUE UNTIL AROUND 700 PM OR 800 PM...THEN TAPER TO LIGHT SNOW AND END AROUND MIDNIGHT.

TOTAL SNOW ACCUMULATION OF 2 TO 4 INCHES IS EXPECTED IN CENTRAL AND EAST-CENTRAL OHIO...WITH 1 TO 3 INCHES IN SOUTH-CENTRAL OHIO.

AN ARCTIC COLD FRONT WILL MOVE THROUGH CENTRAL OHIO BETWEEN 700 PM AND 1000 PM. AFTER THIS FRONTAL PASSAGE...STRONG AND GUSTY NORTHWEST WINDS OF 20 TO 30 MPH CAN BE EXPECTED...WITH A FEW GUSTS NEAR 40 MPH.

THIS WILL CREATE BLOWING AND DRIFTING SNOW. TEMPERATURES WILL RAPIDLY FALL INTO THE TEENS...AND WIND CHILL VALUES WILL DROP TO 10 BELOW TO 20 BELOW ZERO.

A WINTER STORM WARNING IS IN EFFECT FOR ALL OF CENTRAL AND EAST-CENTRAL OHIO EARLY TONIGHT. A SNOW AND BLOWING SNOW ADVISORY IS IN EFFECT FOR SOUTH-CENTRAL OHIO EARLY TONIGHT.

SNOWFALL HAS RANGED FROM 1 TO 3 INCHES OVER CENTRAL.. SOUTH-CENTRAL..

AND SOUTHEAST OHIO SINCE IT BEGAN. ROADS ARE SNOW-COVERED... SLIPPERY... AND HAZARDOUS.

AT 740 PM AN ARCTIC COLD FRONT EXTENDED FROM MANSFIELD SOUTH ACROSS THE EASTERN EDGE OF THE COLUMBUS METROPOLITAN AREA...THEN SOUTH TO THE OHIO RIVER. WEST WINDS OF 20 TO 30 MPH WITH HIGHER GUSTS ARE ACCOMPANYING THIS ARCTIC COLD FRONT.

THIS FRONT WILL REACH NEWARK...LANCASTER...AND VINTON COUNTIES BETWEEN 800 PM AND 830 PM...AND IT WILL REACH ZANESVILLE AND ATHENS BY 900 PM. THE SNOW HAS SLACKENED FROM COLMBUS WEST...BUT IS STILL MODERATE TO HEAVY EAST OF COLUMBUS...AT 740 PM.

TRAVEL IS DISCOURAGED THROUGHOUT CENTRAL...SOUTHEAST...AND SOUTH-CENTRAL OHIO TONIGHT. SHERIFF DEPARTMENT OFFICES REPORTED NUMEROUS TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS. IN ADDITION...THE GUSTY WINDS WILL CREATE CONSIDERABLE BLOWING AND SOME DRIFTING SNOW.

TEMPERATURES WILL FALL INTO THE TEENS...AND THE GUSTY WINDS WILL LOWER WIND CHILL VALUES TO 10 BELOW TO 20 BELOW ZERO ACROSS CENTRAL OHIO.

A Blowing Snow Advisory is issued at 9:30PM for the overnight hours. The Advisory calls for flurries with winds of 15MPH-25MPH with higher gusts. Full text unavailable.

THE WINTER STORM WATCH... WHICH WAS IN EFFECT FOR CENTRAL OHIO EARLIER TONIGHT...IS NOW NO LONGER IN EFFECT. HOWEVER...A BLOWING SNOW ADVISORY IS IN EFFECT FOR CENTRAL OHIO FOR THE REMAINDER OF TONIGHT.

SNOW ACCUMULATED FROM ONE TO THREE INCHES ACROSS CENTRAL OHIO DURING THE LATE AFTERNOON AND EVENING HOURS. SOME LIGHT SNOW OR SNOW FLURRIES CAN BE EXPECTED IN CENTRAL OHIO OVERNIGHT...BUT NO ADDITIONAL SNOW ACCUMULATION IS EXPECTED.

STRONG AND GUSTY NORTHWEST WINDS OF 15 TO 25 MPH CAN BE EXPECTED OVERNIGHT...WITH SOME GUSTS OF 30 TO 40 MILES AN HOUR. THIS WILL CAUSE CONSIDERABLE BLOWING SNOW. DRIFTING SNOW HAS BECOME A PROBLEM... ESPECIALLY ON NORTH-SOUTH ROADS. THE UNION COUNTY SHERIFF DEPARTMENT REPORTED SOME NORTH-SOUTH ROADS NEARLY DRIFTED SHUT IN PLACES.

THE BLOWING SNOW WILL RESTRICT VISIBILITIES TO NEAR ZERO AT TIMES.

WITH THE TEMPERATURE FALLING INTO THE TEENS...WIND CHILL VALUES OF 10 BELOW TO 20 BELOW ZERO WERE OCCURRING IN CENTRAL OHIO AROUND 1000 PM.

THE TEMPERATURE WILL CONTINUE TO FALL INTO THE SINGLE DIGITS...AND DANGEROUSLY COLD WIND CHILL VALUES OF 20 BELOW TO 30 BELOW ZERO CAN BE EXPECTED AFTER MIDNIGHT IN PARTS OF CENTRAL OHIO...ESPECIALLY NORTH AND WEST OF COLUMBUS.

TRAVEL TONIGHT...ESPECIALLY IN OPEN COUNTRY...IS DANGEROUS TONIGHT... AND IS NOT RECOMMENDED.

115 AM EST MON JAN 20 1992

SNOW AND BLOWING AND DRIFTING SNOW WERE BEGINNING TO CREATE TRAVEL PROBLEMS ACROSS CENTRAL OHIO EARLY THIS MORNING.

AT 110 AM NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR INDICATED A LARGE AREA OF SNOW OVER MOST OF CENTRAL OHIO. THIS SNOW AREA HAD INCREASED SIGNIFICANTLY IN COVERAGE SINCE MIDNIGHT AS IT MOVED SOUTHEAST AT 25 MILES AN HOUR.

LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICIALS NORTH AND WEST OF COLUMBUS REPORTED THAT SOME SLICK SPOTS WERE DEVELOPING ON ROADS DUE TO THE SNOW. THE UNION COUNTY SHERIFF REPORTED THAT AROUND A HALF AN INCH OF NEW SNOW HAD FALLEN THERE. WINDS WERE ALSO BEGINNING TO INCREASE CAUSING BLOWING AND DRIFTING SNOW. CONSIDERABLE BLOWING AND DRIFTING SNOW WAS BEING REPORTED IN UNION AND MARION COUNTIES.

SNOW IS LIKELY TO CONTINUE ACROSS MUCH OF CENTRAL OHIO OVERNIGHT WITH ACCUMULATIONS LESS THAN AN INCH. THIS DUSTING OF SNOW COMBINED WITH CONSIDERABLE BLOWING AND DRIFTING SNOW WILL CAUSE TRAVEL TO BECOME HAZARDOUS. MOTORISTS VENTURING OUT OVERNIGHT SHOULD USE CAUTION AND ALLOW EXTRA TRAVEL TIME.

A SNOW AND BLOWING SNOW ADVISORY IS IN EFFECT FOR EAST CENTRAL OHIO EARLY THIS MORNING.

AT 405 AM NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR INDICATED A LARGE AREA OF SNOW COVERING CENTRAL OHIO WEST OF A MARYSVILLE TO CHILlicothe LINE. THE SNOW WAS MOVING SOUTHEAST AT 20 MILES AN HOUR.

THE HEAVIEST SNOW HAS NOW SHIFTED INTO THE AREA EAST AND SOUTHEAST OF COLUMBUS WHERE SNOWFALL AMOUNTS OF ONE TO TWO INCHES HAVE BEEN REPORTED. SNOW CONTINUED TO FALL IN THESE AREAS AND ANOTHER INCH OR SO OF SNOW IS POSSIBLE.

FROM THE COLUMBUS AREA WEST AND SOUTH SNOW HAD DIMINISHED TO FLURRIES AND AROUND A HALF AN INCH OF SNOW HAS BEEN REPORTED. FOUR-TENTHS OF AN INCH OF SNOW FELL AT THE PORT COLUMBUS AIRPORT BETWEEN MIDNIGHT AND 4 AM. TO THE NORTH AND NORTHWEST OF COLUMBUS...BETWEEN A HALF INCH AND AN INCH OF SNOW HAS FALLEN...AND LIGHT SNOW CONTINUED.

LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICIALS THROUGHOUT CENTRAL OHIO REPORT THAT MOST ROADWAYS...ESPECIALLY SECONDARY ROADS...ARE SNOW COVERED AND SLICK. IN MANY AREAS...CONSIDERABLE BLOWING AND DRIFTING SNOW WAS ALSO BEING REPORTED...FURTHER HAMPERING TRAVEL.

THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE HAS ISSUED A WINTER STORM WARNING FOR EAST CENTRAL OHIO FOR THIS MORNING. THIS WARNING INCLUDES MUSKINGUM AND MORGAN COUNTIES.

SNOW CONTINUED TO FALL OVER EAST CENTRAL...SOUTHEAST AND PARTS OF CENTRAL OHIO EARLY THIS MORNING.

AT 555 AM NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR CONTINUED TO INDICATE AN AREA

OF SNOW COVERING CENTRAL OHIO NORTHEAST OF A LONDON TO JACKSON LINE. THE SNOW WAS MOVING SOUTHEAST AT 20 MILES AN HOUR.

THE HEAVIEST SNOW CONTINUED EAST AND SOUTHEAST OF COLUMBUS WHERE GENERALLY TWO TO THREE INCHES OF SNOW HAS FALLEN. THE MUSKINGUM COUNTY SHERIFF REPORTED THAT FOUR INCHES OF NEW SNOW HAD FALLEN JUST SOUTH OF ZANESVILLE OVERNIGHT.

IN GENERAL...SNOW IN THIS AREA WILL BE DIMINISHING TO FLURRIES EARLY THIS MORNING. HOWEVER...OVER EAST CENTRAL OHIO WHERE A WINTER STORM WARNING IS IN EFFECT SNOW WILL CONTINUE INTO MID-MORNING WITH TOTAL STORM ACCUMULATIONS AROUND FOUR INCHES EXPECTED.

AT 1225 AM LICKING COUNTY SHERIFF REPORTED A POSSIBLE FUNNEL CLOUD JUST SOUTH OF NEWARK MOVING TO THE NORTHEAST AT 40 MILES AN HOUR. THIS STORM HAVE PRODUCED SMALL HAIL AND STRONG WINDS AS IT MOVED THROUGH FRANKLIN COUNTY.
