RAIN HAD DIMINISHED IN AREAL COVERAGE BETWEEN 1 AND 130 AM...BUT RUNOFF FROM THE RAIN THAT HAS ALREADY FALLEN WILL KEEP WATER LEVELS RISING AND STREAMS IN FLOOD OVER THE WARNED COUNTIES THROUGH THE EARLY MORNING.

THROUGHOUT THE REMAINDER OF CENTRAL OHIO...NO FLOODING HAD BEEN REPORTED AS OF 130 AM ALTHOUGH SOME PONDING OF WATER IN LOW LYING AREAS WAS OCCURRING. MOTORISTS TRAVELLING EARLY THIS MORNING SHOULD NOT DRIVE THROUGH ANY AREAS WHERE WATER COVERS THE ROAD. THE WATER COULD BE DEEPER THAN YOU THINK AND COULD SWEEP YOUR VEHICLE AWAY. A COLD FRONT OVER WESTERN OHIO AT 130 AM SHOULD MOVE THROUGH CENTRAL OHIO BY 4 AM...ENDING THE THREAT FOR HEAVY RAIN. HOWEVER...RUNOFF FROM UPWARDS OF ONE AND A HALF INCHES OF RAIN WILL CONTINUE TO FEED INTO CENTRAL OHIO RIVERS AND STREAMS...SO PEOPLE IN FLOOD PRONE AREAS SHOULD

CONTINUE TO MONITOR WATER LEVELS AND THE WEATHER SITUATION.
