FLOOD STATEMENT

NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE COLUMBUS OH

542 PM EDT MON JUL 1 1991

THUNDERSTORMS WITH VERY HEAVY RAIN WERE OCCURRING PARTS OF SOUTH-CENTRAL OHIO LATE THIS AFTERNOON.

AT 530 PM NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR INDICATED A CLUSTER OF SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS OVER ROSS...SOUTHERN HOCKING...AND WESTERN VINTON COUNTIES. THESE SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS WERE MOVING SLOWLY EAST AT 15 MILES AN HOUR.

SOME OF THE THUNDERSTORMS WERE PRODUCING BRIEF VERY HEAVY RAIN. THE RATHER SLOW MOVEMENT OF THESE THUNDERSTORMS COULD CAUSE PONDING OF WATER ON ROADWAYS...AND MINOR FLOODING OF LOW-LYING AREAS...LATE THIS AFTERNOON AND EVENING OVER THESE COUNTIES. IN ADDITION...INTENSE LIGHTNING AND GUSTY WINDS COULD ACCOMPANY THESE THUNDERSTORMS. THE ATMOSPHERE IS VERY WARM...HUMID...AND UNSTABLE ACROSS CENTRAL AND SOUTH-CENTRAL OHIO. MORE SCATTERED SLOW MOVING THUNDERSTORMS ARE EXPECTED.

THUNDERSTORMS WERE MOVING ACROSS CENTRAL OHIO THIS EVENING.

SHORTLY AFTER 8 PM A THUNDERSTORM ACCOMPANIED WITH STRONG GUSTY WINDS... FREQUENT LIGHTNING AND HEAVY RAIN MOVED THROUGH THE COLUMBUS METROPOLITAN AREA. WIND GUSTS OF 47 MPH WERE RECORDED AT THE WEATHER OFFICE AT PORT COLUMBUS. THE THUNDERSTORM WAS MOVING EAST ABOUT 15 MPH AND WILL MOVE THROUGH EASTERN FRANKLIN COUNTY AND INTO SOUTHERN LICKING COUNTY BY 9 PM.

PERSONS IN THE PATH OF THIS STORM CAN EXPECT HEAVY RAIN...STRONG GUSTY WINDS AND FREQUENT LIGHTNING.

SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS REDEVELOPED OVER CENTRAL OHIO EARLY THIS MORNING.

AT 225 AM NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR INDICATED AN AREA OF SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS OVER NORTH AND WEST CENTRAL OHIO. THE LEADING EDGE OF THE PRECIPITATION EXTENDED FROM JUST SOUTH OF DAYTON TO MANSFIELD. THE SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS WERE MOVING EAST AT 25 MILES AN HOUR AND WILL REACH THE COLUMBUS AREA BY 3 AM. THESE STORMS MAY PRODUCE BRIEF HEAVY DOWNPOURS AND WIND GUSTS TO 40 MILES AN HOUR. MANY LOCATIONS IN CENTRAL OHIO RECEIVED 1 TO 2 INCHES OF RAIN OVERNIGHT AND THE ADDITIONAL RAINFALL MAY CAUSE PONDING OF WATER IN LOW LYING AREAS.

THUNDERSTORMS WITH HEAVY RAIN AND GUSTY WINDS MOVED THROUGH CENTRAL OHIO EARLY THIS MORNING.

AT 435 AM NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR SHOWED AN AREA OF SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS COVERING MOST OF CENTRAL OHIO. THE STRONGEST THUNDERSTORMS WERE OVER MORGAN...ATHENS...HOCKING AND VINTON COUNTIES. ALL THE PRECIPITATION WAS MOVING EAST AT 25 MILES AN HOUR. THESE THUNDERSTORMS DROPPED 6 TENTHS OF AN INCH OF RAIN AT THE COLUMBUS AIRPORT IN 30 MINUTES AND PRODUCED WIND GUSTS TO 40 MILES AN HOUR.

PORTIONS OF EAST CENTRAL OHIO RECEIVED 2 INCHES OF RAIN EARLIER THIS MORNING AND THE ADDITIONAL RAINFALL MAY RESULT IN PONDING OF WATER AND MINOR FLOODING IN LOW LYING AREAS.

THIS THUNDERSTORM LINE WAS MOVING SOUTHEAST AT 30 MILES AN HOUR...AND WILL MOVE ACROSS DELAWARE AND EASTERN MADISON COUNTIES...AND INTO FAYETTE AND FRANKLIN COUNTIES...BY 800 PM. THIS LINE OF STORMS WILL MOVE INTO THE COLUMBUS METROPOLITAN AREA BETWEEN 800 PM AND 900 PM.

THE UNION COUNTY SHERIFF DEPARTMENT REPORTED SEVERAL TREES DOWNED BY STRONG WINDS IN WESTERN UNION COUNTY.

THE SEVERE THUNDERSTORM WARNING WHICH WAS IN EFFECT FOR MADISON COUNTY EXPIRED AT 800 PM.

THE MADISON COUNTY SHERIFF DEPARTMENT REPORTED THAT STRONG WINDS DOWNED A FEW TREE LIMBS AND TELEPHONE WIRES NEAR LONDON WHEN THE THUNDERSTORMS MOVED THROUGH.

AT 810 PM NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR INDICATED A LINE OF SHOWERS WITH A FEW THUNDERSTORMS EXTENDING FROM MANSFIELD SOUTH THROUGH THE COLUMBUS AREA TO FAYETTE COUNTY ABOUT 10 MILES EAST OF WASHINGTON COURTHOUSE. THESE SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS WERE MOVING SOUTHEAST AT 30 MILES AN HOUR...AND WILL MOVE INTO LICKING...PICKAWAY...AND ROSS COUNTIES BY 900 PM.

THESE SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS HAVE CONSIDERABLY WEAKENED...AND NO LONGER PRESENT A SEVERE WEATHER THREAT. HOWEVER...THEY STILL COULD PRODUCE WIND GUSTS TO 40 MILES AN HOUR...BRIEF HEAVY RAIN...AND INTENSE LIGHTNING AS THEY MOVE ACROSS CENTRAL OHIO EARLY TONIGHT

AT 850 PM NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR INDICATED A 30 MILE WIDE LINE OF THUNDERSTORMS EXTENDING FROM EASTERN HARDING COUNTY...SOUTH ACROSS EASTERN CHAMPAIGN AND CLARK COUNTIES TO NEAR XENIA IN GREENE COUNTY. THIS THUNDERSTORM LINE WAS MOVING EAST AT 30 MILES AN HOUR...AND WILL MOVE ACROSS UNION AND MADISON COUNTIES BETWEEN 900 PM AND 1000 PM. IF THIS THUNDERSTORM LINE HOLDS TOGETHER...IT COULD REACH THE COLUMBUS METROPOLITAN AREA BETWEEN 1030 PM AND 1100 PM.

THIS LINE OF SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS WAS MOVING EAST AT 25 MILES AN HOUR...AND WILL MOVE INTO THE COLUMBUS METROPOLITAN AREA AROUND 1100 PM.

THIS LINE OF SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS HAS WEAKENED SOMEWHAT...BUT COULD STILL CONTAIN FREQUENT LIGHTNING...GUSTY WINDS...AND BRIEF HEAVY RAIN. IT WILL AFFECT THE COLUMBUS AREA...MAINLY NORTH OF INTERSTATE 70.

THIS STORM WAS MOVING SOUTHEAST AT 30 MILES AN HOUR...AND WILL MOVE ACROSS EASTERN DELAWARE COUNTY. THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE AT COLUMBUS RECEIVED TWO UNCONFIRMED REPORTS OF FUNNEL CLOUDS WITH THIS STORM FROM NORTHERN DELAWARE COUNTY. HOWEVER...ATMOSPHERIC CONDITIONS ARE NOT FAVORABLE FOR FUNNEL CLOUD OR TORNADO DEVELOPMENT. PEOPLE IN THE PATH OF THIS STORM CAN EXPECT BRIEF HEAVY RAIN...GUSTY WINDS...AND POSSIBLY SMALL HAIL.

AT 218 PM EDT NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR SHOWED SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS COVERING PORTIONS OF OHIO MAINLY NORTH AND EAST OF A LINE FROM ST MARYS IN MERCER COUNTY TO COLUMBUS THEN SOUTHEAST TO ATHENS IN ATHENS COUNTY. THE SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS WERE MOVING NORTHEAST AROUND 10 MPH.

AT 135 PM WEATHER SERVICE RADAR INDICATED A SHORT LINE OF THUNDERSTORMS ACROSS ATHENS COUNTY JUST SOUTH AND EAST OF ATHENS. THESE STORMS HAVE THE CAPABILITY TO PRODUCE BRIEF TORRENTIAL DOWNPOURS OF RAIN...GUSTY WINDS TO 50 MPH...FREQUENT LIGHTNING...AND POSSIBLY SMALL HAIL.

AS THESE STORMS MOVE SOUTH AT 10 MILES AN HOUR...PEOPLE IN THEIR PATH...INCLUDING THE TOWNS OF LOTTRIDGE AND SHADE...SHOULD MOVE TO SHELTER.

AT 245 PM RADAR INDICATED THAT A THUNDERSTORM WITH VERY HEAVY RAIN...GUSTY WINDS TO 50 MILES AN HOUR...AND POSSIBLY HAIL HAD DEVELOPED RAPIDLY OVER NORTHERN ATHENS COUNTY ABOUT 10 MILES NORTH OF ATHENS. THE STORM WAS MOVING SOUTH AT 10 MILES AN HOUR AND WILL PASS NEAR OR JUST EAST OF ATHENS AND WILL MOVE THROUGH THE CITY OF GUYSVILLE BY 330 PM.

THE STRONGEST STORMS WERE NEAR THE FAYETTE...MADISON COUNTY LINE ABOUT 15 MILES NORTH OF WASHINGTON

COURT HOUSE AND OVER MORGAN COUNTY JUST NORTH OF MCCONNELSVILLE.

THESE STRONGER STORMS COULD PRODUCE SMALL HAIL...GUSTY WINDS TO 40 MILES AN HOUR...AND BRIEF HEAVY RAIN.
