A SEVERE THUNDERSTORM WATCH IS IN EFFECT FOR UNION...MADISON...AND FAYETTE COUNTIES UNTIL 11 PM EDT.

A FLOOD WATCH IS IN EFFECT FOR ALL OF CENTRAL OHIO TONIGHT.

AT 755 PM NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR INDICATED SCATTERED STRONG THUNDERSTORMS MOVING INTO WESTERN FAYETTE COUNTY FROM GREENE AND CLINTON COUNTIES. THESE STORMS WERE MOVING NORTHEAST AT 30 MILES AN HOUR...AND WILL MOVE ACROSS THE NORTHERN HALF OF FAYETTE COUNTY AND INTO SOUTHERN MADISON COUNTY BETWEEN 8 PM AND 9 PM.

THESE STORMS WILL PRODUCE BRIEF VERY HEAVY RAIN...LIGHTNING STRIKES... GUSTY WINDS TO 35 MILES AN HOUR...AND POSSIBLY SMALL HAIL. THE BRIEF VERY HEAVY RAIN COULD CAUSE PONDING OF WATER ON ROADS AND LOW-LYING AREAS. IF THESE STORMS HOLD TOGETHER...THEY COULD REACH THE COLUMBUS METROPOLITAN AREA BETWEEN 930 PM AND 10 PM.

OTHER STRONG THUNDERSTORMS WERE MOVING ACROSS WESTERN OHIO...AND WILL MOVE INTO CENTRAL OHIO AND REACH UNION AND MARION COUNTIES BETWEEN 10 PM AND 11 PM.

THESE SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS ARE MOVING EAST AT 25 MILES AN HOUR AND SHOULD ENTER SOUTHERN LICKING AND NORTHERN FAIRFIELD COUNTIES BY 845 PM EDT.
