**Saturday, March 10, 1990**

620 AM EST SAT MAR 10 1990

DENSE FOG HAS DEVELOPED OVER CENTRAL OHIO EARLY THIS MORNING REDUCING VISIBILITY TO A QUARTER MILE OR LESS IN AREAS.

AT 505 AM EST VISIBILITY AT PORT COLUMBUS INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT WAS ONE-EIGHTH OF A MILE IN DENSE FOG.

THE FOG SHOULD CONTINUE DURING THE MORNING HOURS AND MOTORISTS TRAVELING THROUGH CENTRAL OHIO SHOULD BE EXTRA CAUTIOUS.

A daily record warm low temperature was recorded at Port Columbus. The low of 56 tied the previous record set in 1902.

A daily record warm low temperature was recorded at Port Columbus. The low of 55 broke the previous record of 52 set in 1918.

AT 237 PM THE TEMPERATURE AT THE PORT COLUMBUS INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT REACHED 79 DEGREES SETTING A NEW RECORD HIGH FOR THE DAY. THE PREVIOUS RECORD WAS 77 DEGREEES IN 1944.

THIS IS THE FIFTH DAY IN A ROW THAT RECORD HIGH TEMPERATURES HAVE OCCURRED AT PORT COLUMBUS AIRPORT.

THE LOW TEMPERATURE THIS MORNING WAS 58 DEGREES WHICH IS ALSO A RECORD FOR THE DATE. THE PREVIOUS WARMEST LOW WAS 55 DEGREES SET IN 1955.

A COLD FRONT WAS MOVING ACROSS CENTRAL OHIO EARLY THIS MORNING.

TEMPERATURES ARE EXPECTED TO HOVER AROUND THE FREEZING MARK THIS MORNING IN CENTRAL OHIO FOLLOWING THE PASSAGE OF A COLD FRONT. AS A RESULT SNOW WAS FALLING OVER MUCH OF CENTRAL OHIO AND IS FORECAST TO CONTINUE THROUGH THE MORNING RUSH HOUR.

MOTORIST CAN EXPECT ROADS TO BECOME SLIPPERY ESPECIALLY OVERPASSES AND BRIDGES.

A SNOW ADVISORY IS IN EFFECT FOR ALL OF CENTRAL OHIO TODAY.

SNOW BEGAN FALLING OVER CENTRAL OHIO SHORTLY AFTER MIDNIGHT AND AT 4AM THE SNOW ACCUMULATION AT PORT COLUMBUS AIRPORT WAS ONE INCH. PERIODS OF SNOW WILL CONTINUE TODAY WITH A TOTAL ACCUMUATION OF ONE TO THREE INCHES.

A WINTER STORM WARNING IS IN EFFECT FOR SOUTHERN OHIO TODAY. SOME CITIES IN THE WARNING AREA ARE CINCINNATI...PIKETON...PORTSMOUTH AND ATHENS. SNOW ACCUMULATIONS OF FOUR TO SIX INCHES ARE POSSIBLE IN THE WARNING AREA. SOME SLEET AND FREEZING RAIN MAY BE MIXED WITH THE SNOW.

THUNDERSTORMS WITH VERY RAIN WERE MOVING TOWARD SOUTH CENTRAL OHIO. AT 430 PM EDT NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR SHOWED A LINE OF THUNDERSTORMS WITH VERY HEAVY RAIN FROM KINGMAN TO BLANCHESTER IN CLINTON COUNTY. THIS LINE OF THUNDERSTORMS CAUSED SMALL HAIL...VERY HEAVY RAIN...AND GUSTY WINDS IN FRANKLIN COUNTY INDIANA EARLIER. THE THUNDERSTORMS WERE MOVING EAST AROUND 35 MPH AND WILL REACH WASHINGTON COURTHOUSE BY 500 PM.

632 PM EST SAT APR 28 1990

THUNDERSTORMS WITH HEAVY RAIN... GUSTY SURFACE WINDS AND LIGHTNING WERE MOVING INTO CENTRAL OHIO.

AT 625 PM EDT NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR SHOWED A LARGE AREA OF SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS OVER SOUTHWEST AND SOUTH CENTRAL OHIO. THE AREA OF SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS WAS MAINLY SOUTH AND WEST OF A LINE FROM TROY TO SPRINGFIELD... CHILlicothe AND GALLIPOLIS. THE AREA OF SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS WAS MOVING NORTHEAST AROUND 35 MPH. NO SEVERE WEATHER HAS BEEN REPORTED WITH THESE STORMS BUT THEY ARE CAPABLE OF PRODUCING VERY HEAVY RAIN... DANGEROUS LIGHTNING AND WIND GUSTS IN EXCESS OF 40 MPH.
