A Winter Weather Advisory is issued at 2PM for Central Ohio for the evening and overnight hours. The Advisory is for freezing rain changing to snow with 1"-3" of accumulation. Full text unavailable.

522 PM EST SUN MAR 3 1991

A WINTER WEATHER ADVISORY CONTINUES FOR CENTRAL OHIO INCLUDING THE COLUMBUS METROPOLITAN AREA FOR FREEZING RAIN AND SNOW.

AT 5 PM EST FREEZING RAIN WAS FALLING ACROSS THE COLUMBUS AREA WITH TEMPERATURES AT OR BELOW FREEZING. THE FREEZING RAIN IS FORECAST TO CHANGE TO SNOW OVERNIGHT POSSIBLY ACCUMULATING 1 TO 3 INCHES BY MORNING.

AT 510 PM THE TEMPERATURE WAS 31 AT PORT COLUMBUS WITH TEMPERATURES EXPECTED TO FALL TO THE UPPER 20S BY MORNING.

The Winter Weather Advisory is upgraded to a Winter Storm Warning at 8PM. The warning is for the overnight hours into the morning of Monday, March 4th. The warning calls for a mix of freezing rain, sleet and snow with 1"-3" of snow accumulation. Full text unavailable.

AT 830 PM EST THE TEMPERATURE WAS 30 AT PORT COLUMBUS WITH TEMPERATURES EXPECTED TO FALL TO THE UPPER 20S OVERNIGHT. MOTORIST CAN EXPECT TRAVEL CONDITIONS TO WORSEN AND BECOME HAZARDOUS OVERNIGHT.
