RECORD EVENT REPORT

NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE COLUMBUS OH

436 PM EST MON MAR 2 1992

AT 359 PM EST THE TEMPERATURE AT THE PORT COLUMBUS INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT REACHED 73 DEGREES. THIS IS A NEW RECORD HIGH TEMPERATURE...SURPASSING THE PREVIOUS RECORD HIGH OF 70 DEGREES WHICH WAS SET IN 1976.

132 PM EST SAT MAR 7 1992

A SEVERE THUNDERSTORM WATCH IS IN EFFECT FOR PORTIONS OF SOUTHERN OHIO UNTIL 7PM THIS EVENING. THE WATCH INCLUDES THE FOLLOWING COUNTIES...FAIRFIELD...PICKAWAY...FAYETTE...ROSS...HOCKING...PERRY...MORGAN...ATHENS AND VINTON.

AT 130 PM NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR SHOWED NUMEROUS SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS OVER THE SOUTHERN HALF OF THE STATE. A THUNDERSTORM WITH HEAVY RAIN WAS INDICATED OVER SOUTH CENTRAL ROSS COUNTY ABOUT 10 MILES SOUTH OF CHILLICOTHE. THE SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS WERE MOVING EAST AT 20 MPH.

THUNDERSTORMS WILL CONTINUE TO DEVELOP OVER CENTRAL OHIO THIS AFTERNOON AND EVENING. SOME OF THE THUNDERSTORMS MAY PRODUCE DAMAGING WINDS ALONG WITH LARGE HAIL AND HEAVY RAIN.

351 PM EST SAT MAR 7 1992

A SEVERE THUNDERSTORM WATCH IS IN EFFECT FOR SOUTH CENTRAL AND SOUTHEAST OHIO UNTIL 700 PM.

AT 245 PM NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR INDICATED NUMEROUS SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS ACROSS CENTRAL AND SOUTHEAST OHIO. A LINE OF THUNDERSTORMS EXTENDED FROM DELAWARE SOUTH ACROSS THE NORTHWEST PART OF THE COLUMBUS METROPOLITAN AREA...THEN WEST INTO MADISON COUNTY. ALL OF THE SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS WERE MOVING EAST AT 20 MILES AN HOUR.

AROUND 315 PM...SMALL HAIL WAS REPORTED AT PLAIN CITY ALONG THE UNION/MADISON COUNTY BORDER. THE DUBLIN POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORTED SMALL HAIL AROUND 330 PM. THE THUNDERSTORMS MOVING ACROSS THE COLUMBUS METROPOLITAN AREA NORTH OF INTERSTATE 70 WILL PRODUCE FREQUENT LIGHTNING...BRIEF HEAVY RAIN...AND SMALL HAIL.

THUNDERSTORMS THROUGHOUT CENTRAL...SOUTH-CENTRAL...AND SOUTHEAST OHIO COULD PRODUCE HAIL...STRONG GUSTY WINDS...AND HEAVY RAINFALL.

505 PM EST SAT MAR 7 1992

A SEVERE THUNDERSTORM WATCH IS IN EFFECT FOR SOUTH CENTRAL AND SOUTHEAST OHIO UNTIL 700 PM.

AT 500 PM NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR SHOWED SCATTERED SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS ACROSS ALL OF CENTRAL AND SOUTHCENTRAL OHIO. ALL THE PRECIPITATION WAS MOVING TO THE EAST AT 25 MILES AN HOUR AND WILL CONTINUE OVER CENTRAL OHIO THRU 600 PM.

THE STRONGEST THUNDERSTORMS WERE OVER MARION...UNION AND MADISON COUNTIES. SMALL HAIL AND BRIEF HEAVY RAINFALL WERE REPORTED WITH THESE THUNDERSTORMS. THE THUNDERSTORMS WILL ENTER DELAWARE...FRANKLIN AND PICKAWAY COUNTIES BY 530 PM. NUMEROUS REPORTS OF SMALL HAIL WERE REPORTED THROUGHOUT CENTRAL OHIO BETWEEN 300 AND 500 PM. SEVERAL OCCURRENCES OF PEA SIZE HAIL WERE REPORTED OVER NORTHERN FRANKLIN COUNTY BETWEEN 300 AND 500 PM.

1030 AM EST TUE MAR 10 1992

A LINE OF HEAVY RAINSHOWERS WITH STRONG GUSTY WINDS...ALONG A STRONG COLD FRONT...WAS MOVING EAST ACROSS CENTRAL OHIO THIS MORNING.

AT 1025 AM NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR INDICATED A NARROW BAND OF MODERATE TO HEAVY SHOWERS EXTENDING FROM NEAR MARION SOUTH THROUGH THE COLUMBUS METROPOLITAN AREA...THEN SOUTH INTO WESTERN PICKAWAY AND WESTERN ROSS COUNTIES. THIS BAND OF SHOWERS WAS MOVING EAST AT 40 MILES AN HOUR...AND WAS PRODUCING STRONG GUSTY WINDS TO 40 MILES AN HOUR.

THIS BAND OF HEAVIER SHOWERS WITH STRONG GUSTY WINDS WILL EXTEND FROM NEWARK SOUTH ACROSS LANCASTER AND INTO EASTERN PICKAWAY AND EASTERN ROSS COUNTIES BY 1115 AM.

Wednesday, March 18, 1992

A Winter Storm Warning is issued at 6:50PM for Union, Delaware, Madison and Licking counties in the Columbus metro. It is for the overnight hours and calls for freezing rain changing to rain. Full text unavailable.

Saturday, March 21, 1992

A Winter Storm Watch is issued at 3:20AM for the overnight into Sunday, March 22nd. Full text unavailable. The Winter Storm Watch is upgraded to a Winter Storm Warning at 3PM. It is for the overnight into Sunday, March 22nd, and calls for 2"-4" of snow accumulation overnight with snow and rain mix on Sunday with additional accumulations. Full text unavailable.

546 PM EDT FRI APR 10 1992

A SEVERE THUNDERSTORM WATCH IS IN EFFECT FOR SOUTHEAST AND SOUTH CENTRAL OHIO UNTIL 9 PM EDT. THE WATCH AREA INCLUDES THE CITIES OF CHILLICOTHE...WASHINGTON COURT HOUSE...LANCASTER AND ATHENS.

AT 545 PM EDT NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR SHOWED AN AREA OF SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS OVER WEST CENTRAL AND SOUTHERN OHIO. THE STRONGEST THUNDERSTORMS WERE INDICATED IN SOUTHERN PICKAWAY AND WESTERN HOCKING COUNTIES. THE THUNDERSTORMS WERE MOVING EAST AROUND 40 MILES AN HOUR. THE THUNDERSTORMS HAVE PRODUCED WINDS IN EXCESS OF 50 MILES AN HOUR ALONG WITH BRIEF HEAVY DOWNPOURS AND SMALL HAIL.

807 PM EDT WED APR 15 1992

A SEVERE THUNDERSTORM WARNING REMAINS IN EFFECT UNTIL 830 PM FOR FRANKLIN COUNTY.

AT 805 PM WEATHER RADAR INDICATED A SEVERE THUNDERSTORM MOVING THROUGH SOUTHERN FRANKLIN COUNTY. LARGE TREE LIMBS WERE REPORTED BLOWN DOWN NEAR GROVEPORT WITH THIS STORM AROUND 755 PM. THIS STORM WAS MOVING NORTHEAST AT 45 MILES AN HOUR...AND WILL PASS MOVE OUT OF FRANKLIN COUNTY BY 830 PM.

THE SEVERE THUNDERSTORM WARNING FOR FAYETTE COUNTY HAS BEEN CANCELLED. THESE STORMS HAD MOVED EAST INTO PICKAWAY COUNTY AT 805 PM...AND NO SEVERE WEATHER HAD BEEN REPORTED IN ASSOCIATION WITH THEM. HOWEVER...THE STORMS STILL MAY PRODUCE WINDS UP TO 50 MILES AN HOUR..HEAVY RAIN AND HAIL.

ANOTHER THUNDERSTORM WAS NEAR MARYSVILLE IN UNION COUNTY...MOVING EAST AT 45 MILES AN HOUR. THIS STORM MAY ALSO PRODUCE WINDS NEAR 50 MILES AN HOUR AND IHAIL...AND IT WILL MOVE INTO DELAWARE COUNTY BY 830 PM.

THE SEVERE THUNDERSTORM WARNING FOR LICKING COUNTY EXPIRED AT 915 PM. THE SEVERE THUNDERSTORM WARNINGS FOR MUKINGUM AND PERRY COUNTIES WILL EXPIRE AT 930 PM. THE SEVERE THUNDERSTORM WATCH WHICH WAS IN EFFECT FOR PART OF CENTRAL OHIO EXPIRED AT 9 PM.

AT 920 PM NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR INDICATED A LINE OF THUNDERSTORMS MOVING ACROSS SOUTHERN MUSKINGUM COUNTY AND NORTHERN MORGAN COUNTIES. THESE THUNDERSTORMS HAVE PRODUCED WINDS IN EXCESS OF 60 MILES AN HOUR AND KNOCKED DOWN TREES AND POWERLINES ACROSS LICKING...FAIRFIELD...PERRY AND MUSKINGUM COUNTIES. HOWEVER...THE STORMS HAVE WEAKENED SOMEWHAT SINCE 9 PM AS THEY MOVED EAST AT 50 MILES AN HOUR. THESE STORMS SHOULD MOVE OUT OF MUSKINGUM AND MORGAN COUNTIES BY 10 PM. PEOPLE IN THEIR PATH SHOULD BE ALERT FOR WINDS UP TO 50 MILES AN HOUR...BRIEF HEAVY RAIN...AND POSSIBLY SMALL HAIL.

SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS COVERED MUCH OF THE WESTERN HALF OF OHIO AT 920 PM. THESE SHOWERS AND STORMS WILL MOVE ACROSS CENTRAL OHIO MUCH

OF THE NIGHT.
