537 AM EDT FRI MAY 1 1992

AREAS OF DENSE FOG DEVELOPED OVER CENTRAL OHIO EARLY THIS MORNING. SEVERAL SHERIFF DEPARTMENT OFFICIALS THROUGHOUT CENTRAL AND SOUTHEAST OHIO REPORTED WIDESPREAD DENSE FOG EARLY THIS MORNING. THE MUSKINGUM...PERRY...MORGAN AND ATHENS COUNTY SHERIFFS ALL REPORTED WIDESPREAD AREAS OF DENSE FOG WITH VISIBILITIES NEAR ZERO.

AT 530 AM THE VISIBILITY AT THE ZANESVILLE AIRPORT DECREASED TO 1/8 OF A MILE. PATCHY DENSE FOG WAS REPORTED IN THE COLUMBUS METROPOLITAN AREA WITH VISIBILITIES REDUCED TO 2 MILES OR LESS IN SOME LOCATIONS. THE FOG REMAINED LIGHT TO THE WEST OF COLUMBUS WITH SHERIFF DEPARTMENT OFFICIALS REPORTING VISIBILITIES OF 3 TO 5 MILES.

VISIBILITIES THROUGHOUT CENTRAL OHIO WILL IMPROVE AFTER SUNRISE AND VISIBILITIES SHOULD BE GREATER THAN 3 MILES BY 9 AM.

AT 350 PM NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR INDICATED A LINE OF THUNDERSTORMS FROM NEAR MANSFIELD TO NEAR BELLEFONTAINE IN LOGAN COUNTY. THESE STORMS WERE MOVING RAPIDLY EAST AT 45 MILES AN HOUR... AND WILL MOVE THROUGH MARION AND NORTHERN UNION COUNTIES BY 430 PM. HEAVY DOWNPOURS OF RAIN...WINDS GUSTING TO 50 MILES AN HOUR...AND SMALL HAIL ARE POSSIBLE WITH THESE STORMS. BE ALERT FOR THREATENING WEATHER AND MOVE TO A SAFE PLACE IF SEVERE WEATHER IS SIGHTED OR A WARNING ISSUED. A LINE OF STRONGER STORMS WAS DEVELOPING OVER NORTHWESTERN AND WEST CENTRAL OHIO...AND THESE STORMS WILL MOVE INTO CENTRAL OHIO LATER THIS AFTERNOON AND THIS EVENING.

DELAWARE COUNTY BY 5 PM.

OTHER THUNDERSTORMS WERE IN A LINE FROM NORTH OF MANSFIELD TO JUST NORTH OF TROY...AND THIS LINE OF STORMS WILL MOVE INTO WESTERN MARION AND UNION COUNTIES BETWEEN 445 AND 515 PM. OTHER THUNDERSTORMS NEAR LONDON AND SPRINGFIELD WILL BE MOVING THROUGH MADISON COUNTY THROUGH 530 PM.

ALL OF THESE STORMS HAVE THE POTENTIAL TO PRODUCE HEAVY RAIN...WINDS IN EXCESS OF 50 MILES AN HOUR...AND HAIL.

THE STRONGEST STORMS WERE OVER LICKING AND FAYETTE COUNTIES. BRIEF HEAVY RAIN AND WIND GUSTS TO 40 MILES AN HOUR HAVE BEEN REPORTED WITH THESE STORMS.

ALL OF THE THUNDERSTORMS HAVE THE POTENTIAL TO PRODUCE VERY HEAVY RAIN

AND WIND GUSTS TO 60 MILES AN HOUR.

A 25 MILE WIDE BAND OF THUNDERSTORMS CONTAINING BRIEF VERY HEAVY RAIN... GUSTY WINDS TO 35 MILES AN HOUR...LIGHTNING STRIKES...AND POSSIBLY SMALL HAIL WAS MOVING ACROSS PARTS OF CENTRAL AND SOUTHEAST OHIO THIS EVENING.

AT 705 PM NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR INDICATED A 25 MILE WIDE BAND OF THUNDERSTORMS EXTENDING FROM NEAR LANCASTER IN FAIRFIELD COUNTY...SOUTHWEST ACROSS ROSS COUNTY. THIS THUNDERSTORM BAND WAS MOVING WEST AT 25 MILES AN HOUR...AND WILL MOVE ACROSS PICKAWAY COUNTY AND INTO EASTERN FAYETTE COUNTY BETWEEN 715 PM AND 800 PM. THESE STORMS WILL MOVE ACROSS WESTERN AND SOUTHERN FAIRFIELD COUNTY BY 800 PM.

OTHER SCATTERED SHOWERS AND A FEW THUNDERSTORMS WERE OVERSPREADING THE SOUTHERN HALF OF OHIO AT 705 PM.

SOME OF THE THUNDERSTORMS WILL PRODUCE BRIEF VERY HEAVY RAIN...GUSTY WINDS TO 35 MILES AN HOUR...AND POSSIBLY SMALL HAIL THIS EVENING.

AT 520 PM NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR INDICATED A LINE OF THUNDERSTORMS EXTENDING FROM CLEVELAND SOUTHWEST TO DAYTON AND CINCINNATI. THUNDERSTORMS WITHIN THIS LINE WERE MOVING NORTHEAST AT 35 MILES AN HOUR...WHILE THE LINE ITSELF WAS MOVING SOUTHEAST AT 15 MILES AN HOUR. THIS THUNDERSTORM LINE WILL MOVE INTO ACROSS MARION AND UNION COUNTIES BETWEEN 530 PM AND 630 PM.

THE THUNDERSTORMS MOVING INTO MARION AND UNION COUNTIES WILL PRODUCE STRONG GUSTY WINDS OF 40 TO 50 MILES AN HOUR...INTENSE LIGHTNING... BRIEF VERY HEAVY RAIN...AND POSSIBLY SMALL HAIL. PEOPLE CAUGHT OUTSIDE SHOULD SEEK INSIDE SHELTER WHEN THESE STORMS APPROACH.

THE THUNDERSTORMS OVER EASTERN DELAWARE COUNTY WILL MOVE OUT OF THE COUNTY BY 600 PM.

THIS THUNDERSTORM LINE WAS MOVING EAST AT 35 MILES AN HOUR...AND WILL MOVE ACROSS UNION COUNTY AND INTO MADISON COUNTY BY 700 PM. THESE STORMS WILL MOVE INTO FAYETTE COUNTY BY 715 PM.

THESE THUNDERSTORMS HAVE A HISTORY OF PRODUCING WIND GUSTS OF 40 TO 50 MILES AN HOUR...INTENSE LIGHTNING...AND BRIEF VERY HEAVY RAIN. SMALL HAIL IS POSSIBLE FROM THESE STORMS.

JUST SOUTH OF DELAWARE. THE STORMS WERE MOVING EAST AT 35 MILES AN HOUR. REPORTS FROM AMATEUR RADIO OPERATORS AND LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICIALS INDICATE THAT THESE STORMS ARE CAUSING TORRENTIAL DOWNPOURS OF RAIN... WIND GUSTS UP TO 40 MILES AN HOUR...AND FREQUENT LIGHTNING. THE LINE OF STORMS WILL MOVE INTO THE COLUMBUS METROPOLITAN AREA AND INTO DELAWARE COUNTY BY 730 PM.

THE FORECAST LOW TEMPERATURE FOR TONIGHT OF 45 DEGREES WOULD BE A NEW RECORD LOW FOR JUNE 21. THE CURRENT RECORD IS 46 SET IN 1963. THE FORECAST HIGH FOR SUNDAY OF 58 WOULD BE THE LOWEST MAXIMUM FOR JUNE 21.

CURRENTLY THE LOWEST MAXIMUM FOR JUNE 21 IS 62 WHICH WAS REACHED IN 1961.

THE EXPECTED LOW TEMPERATURE FOR MONDAY MORNING WOULD ALSO BE A RECORD LOW TEMPERATURE. THE LOW IS FORECAST TO BE AROUND 40 DEGREES... WHICH WOULD BREAK THE CURRENT RECORD LOW FOR JUNE 22 OF 44 WHICH WAS SET IN 1961. HOWEVER...THE EXPECTED HIGH FOR MONDAY OF 61 IS HIGHER THAN THE LOWEST MAXIMUM TEMPERATURE FOR JUNE 22 OF 54 WHICH WAS SET IN 1972.
