SCATTERED THUNDERSTORMS WITH BRIEF VERY HEAVY RAIN AND POSSIBLY SMALL HAIL WERE DEVELOPING ACROSS CENTRAL OHIO LATE THIS AFTERNOON.

AT 425 PM NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR INDICATED SCATTERED SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS IN A 30 MILE WIDE BAND EXTENDING FROM MARION SOUTH ACROSS MARYSVILLE IN UNION COUNTY TO NEAR WASHINGTON COURTHOUSE IN FAYETTE COUNTY. THE STRONGEST STORMS WERE IN UNION AND MARION COUNTIES. THIS BAND OF SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS WAS MOVING NORTHEAST AT 25 MILES AN HOUR.

THIS BAND OF SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS WILL MOVE INTO DELAWARE... FRANKLIN... AND PICKAWAY COUNTIES BY 545 PM. SCATTERED THUNDERSTORMS WILL MOVE INTO THE COLUMBUS METROPOLITAN AREA BETWEEN 545PM AND 615 PM SOME OF THE THUNDERSTORMS WILL CONTAIN BRIEF VERY HEAVY RAIN...GUSTY WINDS TO 35 MILES AN HOUR...AND POSSIBLY SMALL HAIL.

AT 540 PM NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR INDICATED SCATTERED SHOWERS AND STRONG THUNDERSTORMS IN A NORTH TO SOUTH BAND ACROSS CENTRAL OHIO. THE STRONGEST STORMS WERE IN MARION...SOUTHERN DELAWARE...SOUTHERN MADISON...FAYETTE...NORTHERN ROSS AND SOUTHERN PICKAWAY COUNTIES. THE SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS WERE MOVING NORTH AT 25 MILES AN HOUR. A RAINFALL OBSERVER IN THE CLINTONVILLE AREA OF COLUMBUS REPORTED SLIGHTLY OVER ONE HALF INCH OF RAIN FROM A THUNDERSTORM BETWEEN 500 PM AND 515 PM.
