NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE COLUMBUS OH

932 AM EDT SAT JUL 2 1994

SCATTERED STRONG THUNDERSTORMS FORMED IN A SMALL PART OF CENTRAL OHIO THIS MORNING.

AT 925 AM NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR INDICATED SCATTERED STRONG THUNDERSTORMS OVER SOUTHERN UNION...EXTREME NORTHERN MADISON...AND INTO CHAMPAIGN COUNTIES. THESE STORMS WERE MOVING EAST-SOUTHEAST AT 20 TO 25 MILES AN HOUR...AND WILL MOVE ACROSS NORTHERN MADISON AND SOUTHERN UNION COUNTIES. THESE STORMS WILL MOVE INTO SOUTHWEST DELAWARE AND NORTHWEST FRANKLIN COUNTIES BY 10 AM.

SOME TOWNS IN THE PATH OF THESE STORMS INCLUDE MILFORD CENTER AND PLAIN CITY IN UNION COUNTY...RESACA AND AMITY IN MADISON COUNTY...AND SHAWNEE HILLS AND POWELL IN DELAWARE COUNTY.

IN NORTHWEST FRANKLIN COUNTY...THE COLUMBUS SUBURBS OF DUBLIN...AMLIN AND HILLIARD ARE IN THE PATH OF THESE STORMS.

THESE STORMS WILL CONTAIN BRIEF VERY HEAVY RAIN...FREQUENT LIGHTNING... AND GUSTY WINDS TO 35 MILES AN HOUR. SMALL HAIL IS ALSO POSSIBLE.

SCATTERED STRONG THUNDERSTORMS WILL MOVE THROUGH THE COLUMBUS METROPOLITAN AREA LATE THIS MORNING.

AT 1030 AM NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR INDICATED SCATTERED SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS OVER DELAWARE...NORTHWEST FRANKLIN...AND MADISON COUNTIES. THE SHOWERS AND THUNDERSTORMS WERE MOVING EAST-SOUTHEAST AT 20 TO 25 MILES AN HOUR...AND WILL AFFECT THE COLUMBUS METROPOLITAN AREA THROUGH NOON.

THE THUNDERSTORMS HAVE SHOWN A TENDENCY TO RAPIDLY DEVELOP AND INTENSIFY...THEN DISSIPATE THIS MORNING IN THE AREA JUST NORTHWEST OF COLUMBUS THIS MORNING.

AT 1030 AM THE STRONGEST STORMS WERE IN WESTERN FRANKLIN COUNTY ABOUT 10 MILES SOUTHWEST OF HILLIARD...IN DELAWARE COUNTY NEAR SUNBURY...AND IN CENTRAL AND NORTHERN MADISON COUNTY.

PEOPLE IN THE COLUMBUS METROPOLITAN AREA AND SURROUNDING COUNTIES SHOULD SEEK INSIDE SHELTER IF ANY THUNDERSTORMS APPROACH LATE THIS MORNING. SOME OF THE THUNDERSTORMS WILL PRODUCE BRIEF VERY HEAVY RAIN...FREQUENT LIGHTNING...AND POSSIBLY SMALL HAIL. GUSTY WINDS TO 35 MILES AN HOUR ARE ALSO POSSIBLE.

THE NORTHERN COLUMBUS SUBURBS. THESE STORMS WERE MOVING EAST AT 20
MILES AN HOUR.

THE CLEVELAND DOPPLER RADAR SHOWED RAINFALL ESTIMATES UP TO 1.6 INCHES
IN AN HOUR FROM THESE STORMS. SOME STREET FLOODING WAS REPORTED BY A
SEVERE WEATHER SPOTTER IN NORTHWEST FRANKLIN COUNTY NEAR INTERSTATE
270.

THE COMBINATION OF SLOW STORM MOVEMENT AND VERY HEAVY RAINFALL WILL
CAUSE URBAN AND SMALL STREAM FLOODING OVER THE NORTHERN PART OF
FRANKLIN COUNTY AND THE NORTHERN COLUMBUS SUBURBS. SOME STREET
FLOODING IS LIKELY.

A SEVERE THUNDERSTORM WATCH IS IN EFFECT FOR CENTRAL AND MUCH OF SOUTHEAST OHIO UNTIL 800 PM EDT.

A SEVERE THUNDERSTORM WARNING IS IN EFFECT FOR FAIRFIELD AND PICKAWAY COUNTIES UNTIL 230 PM EDT.

AT 155 PM EDT THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR IN COLUMBUS WAS INDICATING A LINE OF POSSIBLE SEVERE THUNDERSTORMS OVER CENTRAL OHIO. THIS LINE EXTENDED FROM ASHVILLE TO BALTIMORE. MOVEMENT WAS TOWARD THE EAST/SOUTHEAST AT 25 MILES AN HOUR.

AT 150 PM EDT AN AMATEUR RADIO OPERATOR REPORTED 50 MPH WINDS WITH THIS STORMS AT RINGGOLD...IN EASTERN PICKAWAY COUNTY. THESE THUNDERSTORMS ARE ALSO PRODUCING VERY HEAVY RAIN. EARLIER THUNDERSTORMS PRODUCED 1.55 INCHES OF RAIN AT THE PORT COLUMBUS AIRPORT BETWEEN NOON AND 1 PM. RESIDENTS IN AND NEAR THE COMMUNITIES OF CIRCLEVILLE...AMANDA...AND LANCASTER SHOULD BE PREPARED FOR HEAVY RAIN...STRONG GUSTY WINDS...AND LARGE HAIL THROUGH 230 PM EDT.

AT 215 PM EDT CLEVELAND DOPPLER RADAR INDICATED A LINE OF VERY STRONG TO SEVERE THUNDERSTORMS FROM SOUTH OF ERIE PENNSYLVANIA TO YOUNGSTOWN...TO THE MANSFIELD AREA. ADDITIONAL THUNDERSTORMS WERE OVER CENTRAL OHIO AROUND AND TO THE EAST OF COLUMBUS. THE THUNDERSTORMS WERE MOVING TO THE EAST AT 25 MILES AN HOUR.

DURING THE LATE MORNING HOURS VERY HEAVY RAINS AND LOCALIZED FLOODING WERE ASSOCIATED WITH SEVERAL OF THESE THUNDERSTORMS OVER CENTRAL OHIO. THERE WERE ALSO SOME STRONG GUSTY WINDS AND SMALL HAIL.
