THE USE OF BINOCULARS WILL GREATLY AID THE VIEW OF HALLEY..AND BY GOOD FORTUNE THE PLANETS MARS AND SATURN. SATURN WILL SHINE BRIGHTLY HIGH IN THE SOUTH AND MARS WILL BE THE REDDISH STAR BETWEEN SATURN AND HALLEY.

FRIDAY MORNING TEMPERATURES WILL BE NEAR 10..WITH WINDS 5 TO 10 MPH..

EQUIVALENT WIND CHILL WOULD BE ABOUT 10 BELOW ZERO. THE SATURDAY MORNING LOW WILL BE NEAR 20..WITH MINIMAL WIND CHILL.
