908 AM EST WED MAR 2 1994

RAIN...FREEZING RAIN...AND SLEET WAS FALLING IN CENTRAL OHIO.

AT 904 AM EST NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR IN COLUMBUS INDICATED AN AREA OF RAIN...FREEZING RAIN...AND SLEET IN CENTRAL AND SOUTHEAST OHIO. THE AREA WAS BOUNDED BY A LINE CONNECTING LONDON TO KILLBUCK IN HOLMES COUNTY TO MARIETTA THEN ALONG THE OHIO RIVER TO RIPLEY IN BROWN COUNTY AND BACK TO LONDON. THE AREA WAS MOVING NORTHEAST AT 20 MILES AN HOUR. COUNTY SHERIFF DEPARTMENTS IN ROSS...PICKAWAY...FAIRFIELD...LICKING... AND MUSKINGUM COUNTIES ARE REPORTING FREEZING RAIN AND SLEET. ROADWAYS ARE SLICK AND MANY ACCIDENTS HAVE BE REPORTED. FREEZING DRIZZLE AND SLEET CONTINUE TO FALL AT PORT COLUMBUS AIRPORT. THE RAIN...FREEZING RAIN...AND SLEET WILL CHANGE OVER TO SNOW LATER IN THE MORNING WITH ACCUMULATIONS OF 1 TO 2 INCHES OF SNOW EXPECTED IN CENTRAL OHIO DURING THE DAY.

THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE HAS ISSUED A WINTER WEATHER ADVISORY FOR A PORTION OF CENTRAL OHIO FOR THIS AFTERNOON AND TONIGHT. THIS INCLUDES THE COLUMBUS METROPOLITAN AREA.

A MAJOR LATE WINTER STORM MOVING UP THE EAST COAST WAS PRODUCING A VARIETY OF PRECIPITATION ACROSS OHIO THIS MORNING. OVER THE CENTRAL PORTION OF THE STATE...A MIXTURE OF FREEZING RAIN...FREEZING DRIZZLE AND SLEET WAS FALLING. THIS HAD PRODUCED A GLAZE OF ICE ON MOST SURFACES. THE PRECIPITATION IS EXPECTED TO CHANGE TO SNOW THIS AFTERNOON AND CONTINUE TONIGHT. SNOW WILL ACCUMULATE 1 TO 2 INCHES BY EVENING WITH ADDITIONAL ACCUMULATIONS POSSIBLE TONIGHT.

A WINTER STORM WARNING IS IN EFFECT FOR PARTS OF SOUTHEAST OHIO TODAY AND TONIGHT. SOME CITIES IN THE WARNING AREA ARE...ZANESVILLE...LOGAN AND ATHENS.

A WINTER WEATHER ADVISORY HAS BEEN ISSUED FOR PARTS OF CENTRAL OHIO FOR TODAY AND TONIGHT. SOME CITIES IN THE ADVISORY AREA ARE COLUMBUS... NEWARK...LANCASTER...AND CHILLICOTHE.

AT 1030 AM EST COLUMBUS NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR INDICATED RAIN...FREEZING RAIN...AND SLEET FALLING THROUGHOUT CENTRAL AND SOUTHEAST OHIO. THE HEAVIEST PRECIPITATION WAS FALLING IN A 25 MILE WIDE BAND EXTENDING FROM SOUTHWEST MORGAN COUNTY THROUGH THE CITIES OF ATHENS AND MCARTHUR IN VINTON COUNTY. THE AREA OF PRECIPITATION WAS MOVING NORTHEAST AT 20 MILES AN HOUR.

607 PM EST WED MAR 2 1994

A WINTER STORM WARNING IS IN EFFECT TONIGHT FOR SOUTHEAST OHIO...INCLUDING THE COUNTIES OF

ATHENS... VINTON...MUSKINGUM...HOCKING...MORGAN...AND PERRY.

A WINTER WEATHER ADVISORY IS IN EFFECT TONIGHT FOR THE PART OF CENTRAL OHIO EAST THROUGH SOUTH OF COLUMBUS...INCLUDING THE COUNTIES OF FRANKLIN...MADISON...FAYETTE...ROSS...PICKAWAY...LICKING...AND FAIRFIELD.

AT 600 PM NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR INDICATED AN AREA OF SNOW...MIXED AT TIMES WITH RAIN AND SLEET...OVER THE SOUTHEASTERN THIRD OF OHIO. SURFACE REPORTS AND SHERIFF OFFICE REPORTS INDICATED THAT SNOW WAS FALLING SOUTHEAST OF A LINE FROM NEWARK TO LANCASTER TO CIRCLEVILLE. THE PRECIPITATION AREA WAS NEARLY STATIONARY. ROADS WERE SNOW-COVERED...SLIPPERY AND HAZARDOUS IN THE AREA SOUTHEAST OF A LINE FROM CHILLICOTHE TO LANCASTER TO ZANESVILLE. TRAVEL IN SOUTHEAST OHIO WILL BE HAZARDOUS TONIGHT AS SNOW CONTINUES. SNOW WILL ACCUMULATE 1 TO 3 INCHES IN THE COUNTIES JUST EAST THROUGH SOUTH OF COLUMBUS. HEAVIER SNOW ACCUMULATION OF 4 TO 8 INCHES WILL OCCUR IN SOUTHEASTERN OHIO IN THE COUNTIES UNDER A WINTER STORM WARNING.

THE COLUMBUS METROPOLITAN AREA IS NEAR THE FRINGE OF THE PRECIPITATION. IF THE PRECIPITATION AREA FAILS TO EXPAND NORTHWESTWARD...THEN COLUMBUS WILL REMAIN DRY. HOWEVER...IF THE PRECIPITATION AREA EXPANDS NORTHWESTWARD...THEN IT WILL REACH COLUMBUS. THE BEST CHANCE FOR ACCUMULATING SNOW IN COLUMBUS WILL BE IN SOUTHEASTERN SECTIONS OF THE METRO AREA.

WINTER STORM WATCH

345 PM EST TUE MAR 8 1994

THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE HAS ISSUED A WINTER STORM WATCH FOR THE NORTHWESTERN THREE-QUARTERS OF OHIO FOR WEDNESDAY AND WEDNESDAY NIGHT.

AN AREA OF LOW PRESSURE DEVELOPING OVER SOUTH TEXAS WILL MOVE NORTHEAST TO KENTUCKY BY WEDNESDAY MORNING AND THEN TO WESTERN PENNSYLVANIA BY THURSDAY MORNING. PRECIPITATION WILL SPREAD NORTH ACROSS THE STATE AHEAD OF THIS STORM SYSTEM WEDNESDAY. SNOW SHOULD BEGIN IN SOUTHERN OHIO WEDNESDAY MORNING AND THEN SPREAD

NORTH ACROSS THE STATE BY EARLY WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON. ACROSS THE SOUTHEASTERN HALF OF THE STATE...THE PRECIPITATION IS EXPECTED TO MIX WITH FREEZING RAIN AND SLEET DURING THE AFTERNOON AND THEN CHANGE TO ALL RAIN BY EVENING. THE RAIN WILL THEN CHANGE BACK TO ALL SNOW WEDNESDAY NIGHT AS COLDER AIR MOVES SOUTH ACROSS THE STATE BEHIND THE STORM. THE PRECIPITATION SHOULD REMAIN IN THE FORM OF SNOW ACROSS THE NORTHWESTERN HALF OF THE STATE WEDNESDAY. HOWEVER...SOME SLEET AND FREEZING RAIN MAY MIX WITH THE SNOW EARLY WEDNESDAY NIGHT. TOTAL SNOWFALL AMOUNTS FOR THIS STORM WILL DEPEND HEAVILY ON THE EXACT TRACK OF THIS SYSTEM. AT THIS TIME...THE BEST CHANCES FOR SIGNIFICANT SNOW APPEAR TO BE ACROSS NORTHWEST OHIO.

429 AM EST WED MARCH 9 1994

THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE HAS ISSUED A WINTER STORM WARNING FOR MOST OF OHIO FOR TODAY AND TONIGHT. THE ONLY AREAS NOT IN THE WARNING ARE THE NORTHWEST AND THE EXTREME SOUTH.

A SNOW ADVISORY HAS BEEN ISSUED FOR TODAY AND TONIGHT FOR THE WEST LAKESHORE AND A PORTION OF WEST CENTRAL OHIO.

A WINTER WEATHER ADVISORY IS IN EFFECT THROUGH EARLY AFTERNOON IN EXTREME SOUTH CENTRAL OHIO.

A MAJOR LATE WINTER STORM WILL MOVE FROM THE LOWER MISSISSIPPI VALLEY

...NORTHEAST ALONG THE WEST SLOPES OF THE APPALACHIAN MOUNTAINS TODAY AND TONIGHT. THE STORM WILL DUMP HEAVY SNOW ON A LARGE PORTION OF OHIO AND PERHAPS CAUSE SOME FLOODING IN THE EXTREME SOUTHEAST. THE HEAVIEST SNOW IS EXPECTED TO FALL IN A CORRIDOR FROM CINCINNATI... NORTHEAST THROUGH COLUMBUS AND AKRON INTO NORTHWEST PENNSYLVANIA. ANYWHERE FROM 8 TO 12 INCHES OF SNOW COULD FALL THERE WITH LESSOR AMOUNTS BOUNDING THAT REGION.

SNOW BEGAN TO FALL THIS MORNING IN CENTRAL AND SOUTHEAST OHIO. AT 617 AM EST NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR IN COLUMBUS INDICATED AN AREA OF SNOW COVERING THE SOUTHERN HALF OF OHIO. THE SNOW WILL BEGIN TO FALL IN COLUMBUS BY 700 AM EST. THE AREA OF SNOW WAS MOVING TO THE NORTH AT 20 MPH. AN AREA OF LOW PRESSURE CENTERED IN SOUTHEAST TEXAS WILL MOVE NORTH ALONG THE WEST SIDE OF THE APPALACHIANS PRODUCING 6 TO 10 INCHES OF SNOW TODAY. SNOW WILL TAPER TO FLURRIES LATER TODAY WITH TOTAL ACCUMULATIONS OF 8 TO 12 INCHES. TRAVEL CONDITIONS WILL DETERIORATE AS THE DAY PROGRESSES. ROADWAYS THIS MORNING ARE SLICK AND EXTREME CAUTION IS NEEDED. COUNTY SHERIFF DEPARTMENTS ARE REPORTING A THIN LAYER OF SNOW ON THE ROADS WHICH IS CAUSING ACCIDENTS IN MOST OF CENTRAL OHIO.

A WINTER STORM WARNING IS IN EFFECT FOR CENTRAL OHIO TONIGHT. SOME CITIES
IN THE WARNING AREA ARE COLUMBUS...DAYTON AND MARION.

A WINTER WEATHER ADVISORY IS IN EFFECT FOR MUCH OF EAST CENTRAL OHIO.
SOME CITIES IN THE ADVISORY AREA ARE ZANESVILLE...CIRCLEVILLE AND
CHILLICOTHE.

A FLOOD WATCH IS IN EFFECT FOR SOUTHEAST OHIO TONIGHT. THE FLOOD WATCH
INCLUDES THE CITY OF ATHENS.

THE MIXTURE OF RAIN...FREEZING RAIN...SLEET AND SNOW THAT HAS BEEN FALLING
OVER CENTRAL OHIO IS NOW TURNING TO MOSTLY SNOW. SNOW ACCUMULATIONS
DURING THE DAY HAVE RANGED FROM NEAR AN INCH IN PARTS OF FRANKLIN
COUNTY TO 3-4 INCHES IN DELAWARE COUNTY. THA ADDITONAL SNOWFALL
OVERNIGHT IS EXPECTED TO BE FROM 3 TO 5 INCHES. OVER SOUTHEAST OHIO THE
PRECIPITATION IS EXPECTED TO BE MAINLY RAIN THAT COULD BECOME HEAVY AT
TIMES. ONE TO TWO INCHES OF RAIN HAVE ALREADY FALLEN IN SOUTHEAST OHIO
TODAY AND THE ADDITIONAL RAINFALL COULD CAUSE SOME FLOODING OF STREAMS
AND RIVERS. TRAVEL ACROSS CENTRAL OHIO WILL REMAIN VERY DIFFICULT
THROUGH TONIGHT MOST HIGHWAYS ARE ALREADY SLIPPERY AND WILL BECOME
PARTLY SNOW COVERED. BY THURSDAY MORNING THE SNOW WILL BEGIN TO TAPER
OFF TO OCCASIONAL FLURRIES.

A daily record snowfall was tied a Port Columbus Airport for the date. 2.1" fell, which tied the old
record set in 1962.

713 AM EST THU MAR 10 1994

SNOW CONTINUES TO FALL IN PARTS OF CENTRAL OHIO. AT 708 AM EST COLUMBUS NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR INDICATED AN AREA OF SNOW COVERING MOST OF CENTRAL OHIO. THE AREA WAS MOVING TO THE EAST AT 20 MILES AN HOUR. THIS WILL BE THE FINAL BAND OF SNOW ASSOCIATED WITH THE STORM THAT BROUGHT SNOW AND ICE TO CENTRAL AND SOUTHEAST OHIO YESTERDAY AND EARLY THIS MORNING. NO SIGNIFICANT ACCUMULATION OF SNOW IS EXPECTED FROM THIS AREA OF SNOW. ONCE THIS AREA PASSES THROUGH CENTRAL OHIO CONDITIONS SHOULD RAPIDLY IMPROVE WITH A FEW PEEKS OF SUN IN THE AFTERNOON. TRAVEL IN CENTRAL AND SOUTHEAST OHIO WILL REMAIN POOR DUE TO LAST NIGHTS ICE AND SNOW ACCUMULATIONS. MANY AREAS OF CENTRAL OHIO ARE WITHOUT POWER THIS MORNING AS ICE ACCUMULATED ON POWER LINES CAUSING THEM TO FALL.
