SPECIAL WEATHER STATEMENT

NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE COLUMBUS OH

654 AM EDT SAT SEP 10 1994

THUNDERSTORMS HAVE DEVELOPED OVER CENTRAL OHIO THIS MORNING.

AT 650 AM EDT THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR IN COLUMBUS WAS DETECTING AN AREA OF THUNDERSTORMS OVER UNION AND FRANKLIN COUNTIES...GENERALLY BETWEEN MARYSVILLE AND DUBLIN.

MOVEMENT WAS TOWARD THE EAST/SOUTHEAST AT 25 MILES AN HOUR.

THESE STORMS WILL LIKELY MOVE ACROSS THE COLUMBUS METROPOLITAN AREA THROUGH 8 AM EDT. SMALL HAIL AND FREQUENT LIGHTNING ARE POSSIBLE WITH SOME OF THE STRONGER STORMS.

741 AM EDT SAT SEP 10 1994

THUNDERSTORMS CONTINUE OVER CENTRAL OHIO THIS MORNING.

AT 735 AM EDT THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR IN COLUMBUS AND THE WILMINGTON DOPPLER RADAR WERE DETECTING STRONG THUNDERSTORMS OVER FRANKLIN COUNTY. THE STRONGEST STORMS WERE GENERALLY WITHIN THE I-270 OUTERBELT.

MOVEMENT WAS TOWARD THE EAST/SOUTHEAST AT 25 MILES AN HOUR.

SOME OF THE STRONGER STORMS WILL PRODUCE FREQUENT LIGHTNING AND HEAVY RAIN. A RAINFALL OBSERVER IN DUBLIN REPORTED 0.63 INCHES OF RAIN BETWEEN 705 AND 730 AM EDT. MINOR STREET FLOODING IS POSSIBLE THROUGHOUT THE COLUMBUS AREA THIS MORNING...ESPECIALLY OVER THE NORTHWEST QUARTER OF THE CITY.

THESE STORMS SHOULD MOVE SOUTHEAST OF THE COLUMBUS METROPOLITAN AREA BETWEEN 800 AND 830 AM EDT.

SEVERE WEATHER STATEMENT

836 AM EDT SAT SEP 10 1994

THUNDERSTORMS WERE MOVING THROUGH CENTRAL OHIO THIS MORNING.

AT 830 AM EDT NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR SHOWED THAT THE THUNDERSTORMS HAVE MOVED SOUTHEAST OUT OF FRANKLIN COUNTY INTO PICKAWAY AND FAIRFIELD COUNTY AND WERE MOVING SOUTHEAST ABOUT 25 MILES AN HOUR.

PERIODS OF HEAVY RAINFALL AND FREQUENT LIGHTNING HAVE ACCOMPANIED THESE THUNDERSTORMS. RAINFALL AMOUNTS OF ONE HALF TO ONE INCH ARE POSSIBLE WITH THE THUNDERSTORMS.

THE THUNDERSTORMS WILL CONTINUE TO MOVE SOUTHEAST AND WILL MOVE INTO ROSS AND HOCKING COUNTIES BETWEEN 9 AM AND 930 AM EDT.

616 PM EDT SAT SEP 24 1994

THUNDERSTORMS WERE MOVING INTO CENTRAL OHIO EARLY THIS EVENING. AT 610 PM EDT THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR IN COLUMBUS WAS DETECTING AN AREA OF THUNDERSTORMS MOVING INTO SOUTHERN PICKAWAY COUNTY. THESE STORMS WERE GENERALLY LOCATED BETWEEN CIRCLEVILLE AND CHILLICOTHE.

MOVEMENT WAS TOWARD THE NORTH AT 25 MILES AN HOUR.

THESE THUNDERSTORMS HAVE SHOWN SIGNS OF WEAKENING BUT MAY PRODUCE FREQUENT LIGHTNING AND PERIODS OF BRIEF HEAVY RAIN IN AND NEAR THE COMMUNITIES OF CIRCLEVILLE AND ASHVILLE THROUGH 700 PM.

THUNDERSTORMS CONTINUE TO MOVE INTO CENTRAL OHIO THIS EVENING. AT 628 PM EDT THE COLUMBUS NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR WAS INDICATING A LINE OF STRONG THUNDERSTORMS MOVING INTO SOUTHERN FAYETTE COUNTY. THESE STORMS EXTENDED FROM ABOUT 8 MILES SOUTH OF WASHINGTON COURT HOUSE TO NEAR PEEBLES IN ADAMS COUNTY.

MOVEMENT WAS TOWARD THE NORTH AT 25 MILES AN HOUR.

THESE STORMS WILL LIKELY MOVE NORTHWARD ACROSS FAYETTE COUNTY THROUGH 730 PM. SMALL HAIL...FREQUENT LIGHTNING...AND PERIODS OF BRIEF HEAVY RAIN IS POSSIBLE FROM SOME OF THE STRONGER STORMS.

THUNDERSTORMS WITH HEAVY RAIN WERE ALSO LOCATED IN PICKAWAY COUNTY NEAR CIRCLEVILLE. THE WILMINGTON DOPPLER RADAR HAS INDICATED THAT THESE STORMS PRODUCED BETWEEN ONE-HALF AND ONE INCH OF RAIN OVER PORTIONS OF ROSS COUNTY EARLIER THIS EVENING.

STRONG THUNDERSTORMS WERE MOVING ACROSS MADISON COUNTY THIS EVENING. AT 715 PM EDT THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR IN COLUMBUS WAS INDICATING A STRONG THUNDERSTORM OVER SOUTHERN MADISON COUNTY. THIS STORM WAS JUST SOUTH OF LONDON NEAR THE TOWN OF NEWPORT.

MOVEMENT WAS TOWARD THE NORTH AT 25 MILES AN HOUR.

THIS STORM WILL LIKELY MOVE OVER THE LONDON AREA BETWEEN 730 AND 745 PM. ANOTHER STRONG THUNDERSTORM WAS DETECTED OVER NORTHWEST MADISON COUNTY.

THIS STORM WAS LOCATED NEAR PLUMWOOD...AND WILL LIKELY MOVE INTO SOUTHWEST UNION COUNTY BY 745 PM.

THESE THUNDERSTORMS HAVE SHOWN SIGNS OF WEAKENING OVER THE PAST HOUR BUT FREQUENT CLOUD-TO-GROUND LIGHTNING AND HEAVY RAIN IS STILL POSSIBLE.

THESE THUNDERSTORMS WERE PRODUCING HEAVY RAIN. THE WILMINGTON DOPPLER RADAR HAS ESTIMATED THAT OVER 1 INCH OF RAIN HAS FALLEN BETWEEN 700 AND 800 PM EDT OVER AN AREA BETWEEN PATASKALA AND PICKERINGTON. THESE STORMS WILL LIKELY MOVE NORTHWARD OVER THE WESTERN THIRD OF LICKING COUNTY THROUGH 845 PM EDT. HEAVY RAIN AND PONDING OF WATER ON HIGHWAYS CAN BE EXPECTED IN AND NEAR THE COMMUNITIES OF PATASKALA...SUMMIT STATION AND JERSEY.
