..A TRAVELERS ADVISORY IS IN EFFECT FOR THE MIAMI VALLEY..CENTRAL..AND SOUTHWEST PARTS OF OHIO FOR TONIGHT..

A DEVELOPING LOW PRESSURE SYSTEM OVER SOUTHERN GEORGIA THIS AFTERNOON IS FORECAST TO MOVE NORTHEAST TONIGHT AND FRIDAY WITH A MIXTURE OF PRECIPITATION FOR THE BUCKEYE STATE. THE LOW SHOULD BE CENTERED OVER EASTERN NORTH CAROLINA WITH LOW PRESSURE EXTENDING WEST ACROSS THE MID AND LOWER PARTS OF THE OHIO VALLEY AROUND DAYBREAK FRIDAY. BY FRIDAY EVENING THE LOW WILL BE CENTERED OFF THE NEW ENGLAND COAST. RAIN..FREEZING RAIN..SLEET..AND SNOW WILL SPREAD NORTH ACROSS THE SOUTHERN COUNTIES TONIGHT AND POSSIBLY REACH THE NORTHERN SECTIONS OF OHIO DURING THE EARLY MORNING HOURS. MOST THE PRECIPITATION WILL BE IN THE FORM OF RAIN AND FREEZING RAIN TONIGHT AND LITTLE OR NO SNOW ACCUMULATIONS ARE FORECAST FOR THE STATE. THERE IS A GREATER RISK OF SNOW ON FRIDAY..MAINLY IN THE NORTHEAST PART.

FREEZING RAIN AND SLEET WAS OCCURRING OVER THE SOUTHERN HALF OF THE STATE AND WAS SPREADING NORTH SLOWLY. TEMPERATURES WERE RANGING FROM THE UPPER 20S IN THE NORTHERN PART OF THE ADVISORY AREA TO THE FREEZING MARK IN THE SOUTH.

FREEZING RAIN..DRIZZLE AND SOME SLEET FELL ACROSS THE SOUTHERN HALF OF THE STATE DURING THE NIGHT AND WAS SPEADING INTO THE NORTHEASTERN PART OF OHIO AT EARLY MORNING. THE FREEZING RAIN IS FORECAST TO CHANGE TO LIGHT SNOW DURING THE DAY.. EXCEPT IT MAY BE MIXED WITH RAIN IN THE SOUTHEAST INTO THE EVENING.

SNOW WAS COATING THE HIGHWAYS IN CENTRAL OHIO THIS MORNING. AT 540AM THE SNOW DEPTH AT PORT COLUMBUS WAS AROUND 1/2 INCH AND MODERATE SNOW WAS FALLING. THE TEMPERATURE WAS 32 DEGREES. THE TEMPERATURE MAY DROP A DEGREE OR TWO.. WHICH WILL MAKE STREETS AND HIGHWAYS WHICH HAVE NOT BEEN TREATED VERY SLIPPERY. THE COLUMBUS WEATHER RADAR SHOWED THE WESTERN EDGE OF THIS SNOW AREA WAS OVER MADISON COUNTY. IT WAS MOVING EAST AT 30 MPH. SNOW SHOULD DIMINISH IN THE COLUMBUS AREA BEFORE 7AM TODAY.. HOWEVER MORE SNOW IS LIKELY DURING THE DAY WITH LITTLE ADDITIONAL ACCULUMATION.

A LIGHT SNOW COVER IS CAUSING SLIPPERY HIGHWAYS IN CENTRAL OHIO THIS MORNING. SNOW FLURRIES WHICH WERE ASSOCIATED WITH A COLD FRONT THAT WAS MOVING THROUGH CENTRAL OHIO EARLY THIS MORNING WERE ACCUMULATING ON THE STREETS IN COLUMBUS. THE TEMPERATURE AT PORT COLUMBUS DROPPED FROM 31 AT 5 AM TO 29 AT 6AM. THE TEMPERATURE WILL RISE VERY LITTLE IF ANY TODAY. SNOW FLURRIES ARE EXPECTED TO CONTINUE IN CENTRAL OHIO THIS MORNING..BUT WITH LITTLE ADDITIONAL ACCUMULATION.

A WINTER STORM WATCH IS IN EFFECT FOR THE SOUTHERN HALF OF OHIO FOR TONIGHT AND THURSDAY.

A MAJOR WINTER STORM TAKING SHAPE OVER THE SOUTHWESTERN UNITED STATES WILL MOVE EAST INTO THE LOWER MISSISSIPPI VALLEY TONIGHT AND WILL PASS SOUTH OF THE OHIO VALLEY ON THURSDAY.

THE EXACT COURSE OF THE LOW PRESSURE AREA IS UNCERTAIN AT THIS TIME BUT AN AREA OF HEAVY SNOW WILL BE NORTH OF THE STORMS PATH. AT THIS TIME IT SEEMS LIKELY THAT AT LEAST PART OF SOUTHERN OHIO WILL HAVE HEAVY SNOW WITH LIGHTER SNOW OVER NORTHERN OHIO.

THE SNOW IS EXPECTED TO BEGIN IN SOUTHWESTERN OHIO LATE THIS AFTERNOON OR THIS EVENING AND SPREAD ACROSS MOST OF THE STATE BY THURSDAY MORNING. SNOW WILL CONTINUE THEN THROUGH THE DAY THURSDAY.

A WINTER STORM WARNING IS IN EFFECT FOR THE SOUTHWESTERN COUNTIES OF OHIO TONIGHT AND OVER ALL OF OHIO LATE TONIGHT AND THURSDAY.

A MAJOR WINTER STORM WAS DEVELOPING OVER THE TEXAS-OKLAHOMA PANHANDLE THIS AFTERNOON. THIS STORM HAD SPREAD SNOW INTO IOWA AND MISSOURI BY LATE AFTERNOON. HEAVY AMOUNTS OF SNOW HAD FALLEN OVER

KANSAS AND MISSOURI..AND IS HEADED TOWARD OHIO.
SNOW SHOULD SPREAD INTO THE SOUTHWEST PART OF OHIO EARLY TONIGHT THEN
ADVANCE ACROSS THE REMAINDER OF THE STATE BY EARLY THURSDAY MORNING.
THE SNOW WILL CONTINUE DURING THURSDAY POSSIBLY BECOMING HEAVY AT
TIMES. THE SNOW WILL CAUSE HAZARDOUS TRAVEL CONDITIONS AND MOTORISTS
SHOULD PLAN THEIR TRAVEL ACCORDINGLY OVER THE NEXT 48 HOURS.

THE WINTER STORM WARNINGS FOR OHIO FOR TODAY HAVE BEEN CANCELLED BUT A
TRAVELERS ADVISORY IS IN EFFECT FOR THE ENTIRE STATE.

A MAJOR WINTER STORM MOVING OUT OF THE SOUTHWESTERN UNITED STATES WAS
CAUSING WIDESPREAD SNOW THROUGHOUT THE MIDWEST THIS MORNING.

HOWEVER.. THE STORM WAS WEAKENING SOMEWHAT AND MOST OF THE SNOW WAS
NOT ACCUMULATING RAPIDLY IN AREAS TO THE WEST OF OHIO.

SNOW DID MOVE INTO WESTERN OHIO DURING THE PREDAWN HOURS THIS MORNING
AND IT IS LIKELY TO ACCUMULATE 2 TO 4 INCHES IN MOST AREAS BY THIS

EVENING. SOME SIGNIFICANT ACCUMULATION IS POSSIBLE BY THE MORNING RUSH
HOUR.. ESPECIALLY IN SOUTHWESTERN OHIO. EXTREME EASTERN SECTIONS OF THE
STATE MAY SEE SOME SNOW.. BUT WILL PROBABLY GET THROUGH THE RUSH HOUR
PERIOD BEFORE THE HEAVIER SNOW BEGINS.

THE CENTER OF THE LOW PRESSURE AREA CAUSING THE SNOW WAS MOVING INTO
ARKANSAS JUST BEFORE SUNRISE THIS MORNING. THE STORM CENTER WILL TRACK
EAST.. MOVING ALONG THE TENNESSEE..KENTUCKY BORDER TONIGHT AND ARRIVE
OVER THE MIDDLE ATLANTIC COAST BY FRIDAY MORNING.

SNOW WILL CONTINUE IN OHIO EARLY TONIGHT AS THE STORM CENTER PASSES TOR
THE SOUTH. THE SNOW SHOULD BEGIN TO TAPER OFF TO FLURRIES LATE
TONIGHT.. ESPECIALLY IN WESTERN SECTIONS OF THE STATE.

PRECIPITATION FELL OVER MOST OF THE BUCKEYE STATE LAST NIGHT AND MORE IS FORECAST FOR TODAY. SNOW BEGAN FALLING IN THE SOUTHWESTERN COUNTIES EARLY LAST NIGHT WITH ACCUMULATIONS OF A LITTLE OVER THREE INCHES AT CINCINNATI AND JUST OVER AN INCH AT DAYTON. THE SNOW SPREAD NORTH AND REACHED THE SHORES OF LAKE ERIE AFTER MIDNIGHT. THE NORTHERN COUNTIES SHOULD HAVE AROUND AN INCH OF NEW SNOW BY DAYBREAK.

WHILE THE SNOW WAS DEVELOPING IN THE NORTH HIGHER TEMPERATURES CHANGED THE SNOW TO RAIN OVER THE THE EXTREME SOUTHERN SECTIONS. A CHANGE OVER TO RAIN OR A MIX IN OF RAIN WILL SPREAD NORTH INTO THE CENTRAL COUNTIES DURING THE MORNING WHILE IN THE EXTREME NORTH ONLY SNOW WILL FALL.

COLDER AIR MOVING BACK INTO THE STATE DURING THE AFTERNOON WILL BRING THE PRECIPITATION BACK TO ALL SNOW OVER ALL OF OHIO.

SNOW AMOUNTS WILL NOT BE GREAT TODAY WITH 1 TO 3 INCHES EXPECTED IN THE NORTHERN AND CENTRAL PARTS AND AN INCH OR LESS OF ADDITIONAL SNOW IN THE SOUTHERN COUNTIES BY EVENING.
