AT 3AM EDT THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR AT PORT COLUMBUS INDICATED VERY STRONG THUNDERSTORMS OVER EXTREME SOUTHERN PICKAWAY COUNTY OF CENTRAL OHIO DRIFTING NORTHEAST AT ABOUT 10 MILES PER HOUR. FREQUENT LIGHTNING..VERY HEAVY RAIN AND POSSIBLY SMALL HAIL MAY BE EXPECTED FROM THESE THUNDERSTORMS. BECAUSE OF THE SLOW MOVEMENT OF THESE THUNDERSTORMS COMBINED WITH HEAVY RAIN..FLOODING OF SMALL STREAMS AND LOW-LYING AREAS MAY BECOME A PROBLEM.

THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR AT PORT COLUMBUS INDICATED VERY STRONG THUNDERSTORMS OVER EXTREME SOUTHWEST FRANKLIN..NORTHERN PICKAWAY AND WESTERN FAIRFIELD COUNTIES OF CENTRAL OHIO MOVING NORTHEAST AT 15 MILES PER HOUR.

BRIEF PERIODS OF HEAVY RAIN AND SOME HAIL IS POSSIBLE FROM THESE THUNDERSTORMS FOR THE NEXT FEW HOURS. ONE HALF INCH HAIL WAS REPORTED IN REYNOLDSBURG OHIO..IN EAST CENTRAL FRANKLIN COUNTY. THUNDERSTORMS WERE MOVING SOUTHEAST AT AROUND 20 MPH.

.....THUNDERSTORMS SHOWING UP IN FAIRFIELD COUNTY IN CENTRAL OHIO.... AT 805PM EDT WEATHER SERVICE RADAR IN COLUMBUS SHOWED SEVERAL THUNDERSTORMS WITH VERY HEAVY RAIN IN FAIRFIELD COUNTY IN CENTRAL OHIO. HEAVIEST THUNDERSTORM WAS LOCATED NEAR THURSTON IN THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF FAIRFIELD COUNTY. THESE THUNDERSTORMS COULD CAUSE SOME FLOODING OF STREETS AND LOW LYING AREAS AS THEY DRIFT TOWARD THE NORTH AT ONLY AROUND 10 MPH. FREQUENT VIVID LIGHTNING AND SOME SMALL HAIL IS ALSO POSSIBLE. THESE THUNDERSTORMS SHOULD BEGIN TO DECREASE IN INTENSITY

HEAVIEST THUNDERSTORM WAS LOCATED NEAR LANCASTER. THUNDERSTORMS WITH VERY HEAVY RAIN WERE ALSO INDICATED OVER NORTHERN HOCKING COUNTY IN CENTRAL OHIO. THESE THUNDERSTORMS COULD CAUSE SOME FLOODING OF STREETS AND LOW LYING AREAS AS THEY DRIFT TOWARD THE NORTH AT ONLY AROUND 10 MPH. FREQUENT VIVID LIGHTNING AND SOME SMALL HAIL IS ALSO POSSIBLE. AT 1020PM EDT THE HEAVIEST THUNDERSTORM IN CENTRAL OHIO WAS LOCATED OVER SOUTHWEST LICKING COUNTY. THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE HAS ISSUED A FLASH FLOOD WATCH FOR
ALL BUT EXTREME SOUTHERN OHIO.

THIS WATCH IS TO BE IN EFFECT FOR THIS AFTERNOON AND TONIGHT.

URBAN AND SMALL STREAM FLOODING WAS WIDESPREAD IN NORTHERN OHIO TODAY
AND THE GROUND IN THE NORTHERN COUNTIES IS NOW PRETTY WELL SATURATED.

A FRONT WAS EAST-WEST ACROSS NORTHERN OHIO THIS AFTERNOON AND WAS
MOVING SLOWLY SOUTH. THE FRONT WILL DRIFT AS FAR SOUTH AS JUST NORTH
OF A LINE FROM DAYTON THROUGH COLUMBUS TONIGHT. LAST NIGHT AND EARLIER
TODAY RAINFALL WAS VERY HEAVY IN THE AREA OF THE FRONT. RAINFALL
AMOUNTS WERE IN THE TWO TO FIVE INCH RANGE.

HEAVY RAIN WILL CONTINUE TO FALL ALONG THE FRONT WITH TWO TO FIVE INCH
AMOUNTS POSSIBLE DURING THE NEXT 12 HOURS.

IF THIS MUCH RAIN DOES FALL MANY RIVERS AND STREAMS WILL RISE OUT OF
THEIR BANKS. PEOPLE LIVING OR DRIVING ALONG STREAMS IN THE NORTHERN
THREE QUARTERS OF OHIO SHOULD BE ALERT FOR THE ONSET OF HEAVY RAINS
AND RAPID RISES IN STREAM LEVELS.
