545 AM EST THU DEC 8 1983

..THE SNOW DEPTH AT PORT COLUMBUS AT 545 AM WAS 2 INCHES..

AT 545 AM THE COLUMBUS WEATHER RADAR SHOWED A AREA OF LIGHT SNOW OVER CENTRAL OHIO FROM COLUMBUS TO WASHINGTON COURT HOUSE. THIS AREA WAS MOVING NORTHEAST AROUND 20 MPH.

EVEN THOUGH NOT A GREAT DEAL OF FURTHER ACCUMULATION OF SNOW IS EXPECTED THIS MORNING..THE TEMPERATURE WILL REMAIN BELOW FREEZING IN CENTRAL OHIO. THIS HAS CAUSED UNTREATED STREETS AND HIGHWAYS TO BECOME SLIPPERY. THESE CONDITIONS WILL PERSIST THROUGH THE EARLY MORNING HOURS.

AT 830AM EST THE TEMPERATURE AT PORT COLUMBUS HAD DROPPED BELOW FREEZING...WITH COLDER AIR MOVING IN FROM THE WEST. NORTHWEST WINDS AND TEMPERATURES IN THE 20S TODAY WILL CAUSE WIND CHILL FACTORS AROUND ZERO DEGREES FAHRENHEIT.

ROADS...BRIDGES...AND WALKWAYS ARE WET AND CAN BE EXPECTED TO FREEZE DURING THE MORNING HOURS.

830 AM EST SAT DEC 24 1983

...NEW RECORD LOW AND STRONG WINDS ATTACK CENTRAL OHIO...

AT 8 AM EST THE TEMPERATURE AT PORT COLUMBUS WAS MINUS 10 DEGREES FAHRENHEIT. THE OLD RECORD WAS MINUS 7 IN 1878. AVERAGE WINDS 20 TO 25 MPH WERE CAUSING WIND CHILL EQUIVALENT TEMPERATURES OF MINUS 50 TO MINUS 60 DEGREES FAHRENHEIT. THESE DANGEROUS CONDITIONS WILL PERSIST TODAY...AND PERHAPS MOST OF THE WEEKEND. IF YOU VENTURE OUTSIDE OR TRAVEL...TAKE PRECAUTIONS TO PROTECT YOURSELF FROM FROSTBITE.

..NEW RECORD LOW FOR CHRISTMAS DAY AND CHRISTMAS EVE FOR COLUMBUS...

JUST AFTER MIDNIGHT...1230 AM EST...THE TEMPERATURE AT PORT COLUMBUS AIRPORT WAS MINUS 12 DEGREES FAHRENHEIT. THE OLD RECORD FOR DECEMBER 25 WAS MINUS 5 DEGREES...SET IN 1980. THE TEMPERATURE FIRST REACHED MINUS 12 AT 830 PM EST DECEMBER 24... ESTABLISHING A NEW RECORD FOR CHRISTMAS EVE. TEMPERATURES BELOW OR NEAR ZERO MOST OF TODAY...COMBINED WITH STRONG WESTERLY WINDS...WILL CAUSE DANGEROUS WIND CHILLS.
