248 AM EST SAT DEC 2 1984

THE 1.45" OF RAINFALL AT PORT COLUMBUS YESTERDAY ESTABLISHED A NEW RECORD FOR THE DATE. IT BROKE THE PREVIOUS RECORD OF 1.34" SET IN 1940 AND 1969.

THE FIRST REPORTED SNOWFALL FOR NOVEMBER FOR CENTRAL OHIO HAS BEEN RECEIVED. AT NOON TODAY.. THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE OFFICE AT PORT COLUMBUS RECEIVED A PHONE CALL FROM A RESIDENT NEAR THE MORROW COUNTY/DELAWARE COUNTY LINE NORTH OF SUNBURY OHIO.. WHO REPORTED A HEAVY SNOW SHOWER. THE SNOW STARTED AT ABOUT 1130AM AND LASTED 20 MINUTES. THE SNOW BRIEFLY COVERED THE GROUND.. THEN RAPIDLY MELTED AFTER IT STOPPED. PRECIPITATION WAS INDICATED IN THAT AREA AT THAT TIME BY THE NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE RADAR.

...A TRAVELERS ADVISORY IS IN EFFECT FOR THE NORTHERN TWO THIRDS OF OHIO FOR THIS AFTERNOON...

SNOW HAD SPREAD OVER ALL OF OHIO BUT THE EXTREME NORTH PART BY 10AM. DAYTON ALREADY HAD TWO INCHES OF SNOW ON THE GROUND. THE SNOW WILL SPREAD OVER NORTHERN OHIO BY EARLY AFTERNOON. NATIONAL WEATHER SERVICE FORECASTS CALL FOR ANYWHERE FROM ONE TO THREE INCHES OF SNOW BY EVENING. THE SNOW MAY BE MIXED WITH SLEET.

...A TRAVELERS ADVISORY IS IN EFFECT FOR CENTRAL OHIO TONIGHT...

SNOW NEVER MOVED INTO THE NORTHERN THIRD OF OHIO SO THE ADVISORY FOR THAT PART OF THE STATE WAS CANCELLED. SNOW IS LIKELY TONIGHT BUT WITH ACCUMULATION OF ONE INCH OR LESS.

IN THE CENTRAL PART OF THE STATE THE SNOW WILL CONTINUE. ONE TO TWO INCHES OF SNOW WAS REPORTED DURING THE AFTERNOON. THE SNOW WAS SLUSHY AND DID NOT ACCUMULATE IN LARGE AMOUNTS ON HIGHWAYS. HOWEVER.. VISIBILITIES WERE POOR. THERE WILL BE AN ADDITIONAL INCH OR TWO OF SNOW DURING THE NIGHT. IT WILL BE WET AND SO THE ACCUMULATION ON ROADS

WILL BE CONTINUED SLUSHY. THAT COMBINED WITH POOR VISIBILITIES WILL MAKE TRAVEL DIFFICULT TONIGHT.

THE RAIN IN CENTRAL OHIO COULD BECOME A MIXTURE OF RAIN AND SNOW DURING THE MORNING RUSH HOUR. DRIVERS ARE URGED TO USE CAUTION THIS MORNING AS SOME ISOLATED SLIPPERY SPOTS COULD OCCUR.

SLIPPERY ROAD CONDITIONS MAY DEVELOP OVER CENTRAL OHIO AS WET ROADWAYS AND OVERPASSES BECOME ICY. TEMPERATURES WILL BE DROPPING THROUGH THE 30S TO NEAR FREEZING DURING THE MORNING RUSH HOURS. LOW DEW POINTS AND BRISK WINDS WILL HELP CAUSE WATER ON ROADS..SIDEWALKS AND ESPECIALLY OVERPASSES TO BECOME ICE. LATER TODAY..A COLD MOIST FLOW WILL CAUSE SNOW FLURRIES TO DEVELOP.. BUT SIGNIFICANT ACCUMULATION IS NOT EXPECTED IN CENTRAL OHIO.

...A WINTER STORM WARNING IS IN EFFECT FOR A BROAD BAND ACROSS OHIO...

THIS COVERS AN AREA FROM SOUTHWEST TO EAST CENTRAL OHIO. 4 TO 6 INCHES OF SNOW IS FORECAST BY THURSDAY MORNING IN THAT BAND.

TRAVELERS ADVISORIES ARE IN EFFECT FOR THE NORTHEAST LAKESHORE AND THE NORTHWEST AND NORTH CENTRAL FOR 2 TO 4 INCHES OF SNOW AND FOR 1 TO 3 INCHES IN SOUTH CENTRAL WHICH WILL BE MIXED WITH RAIN AT TIMES.

A STORM AREA OVER ALABAMA WAS SPREADING SNOW NORTH THROUGH OHIO WITH THE SNOW TO BEGIN ACROSS THE NORTHERN THIRD DURING THE EVENING. THE STORM WILL INTENSIFY AND MOVE RAPIDLY NORTHEAST TOWARD THE MID ATLANTIC COAST EARLY THURSDAY.
